the Thanksgiving season. The Knights' Order worked with Families First, all the food collected was given to families in Pen Argyl and our community that needed a little extra help to get through the holiday. The Plainfield Elementary School, Wind Gap Middle School, and the District Office all joined the high school in collecting donations! Not only did the members of Pen Argyl School District donate to this cause, but local businesses and community members also donated items. We wanted to give a special thanks to Krise Transportation for the use of their bus and the YMCA for the use of their gym for sorting and distributing food. Cub Scout Pack 34 donated over 1900 pounds of food thanks to their "Scouting for Food" drive. Thanks to the help from the community, we collected 13,819 items and were able to feed over 70 families. The Knights' Order, the Character Education program at the Pen Argyl High School that organized the event, is responsible for service projects throughout the school and community. The Knights' Order wanted to give back to the community that has been so supportive of their other initiatives.






