For the Bereaved Mothers and Children on Mother's Day By Sarah Janelle Loren

Mother's Day is a time to honor mothers and reflect upon all the sacrifices our mothers have made for us, the memories we've created, and the thanks we owe to the amazing women who have given us life. For some however, it is also a time of remembrance, to grieve the loss of a mother or child. I cannot speak for those who have lost mothers or children. I cannot even begin to imagine the indescribable pain, which I'm sure is the ultimate definition of "understatement." The only thing I have to offer is wisdom, insight, advice, and hopefully a bit of comfort, from those who do understand exactly what it is that you're feeling. This Mother's Day, may we honor all mothers: those who are living and those who have passed; those who hold their children's hands and those who are no longer able.

For Bereaved Children

Roxann Ealey of Pen Argyl remembers her late mother, Marie Buskirk, who passed in 2010.

"Every one of the firsts the year after my mom passed were difficult. The most difficult was when my siblings and I were together. It was always like the elephant in the room. It was obvious that mom wasn't there, but she was there at the same time. That changed when we all started sharing memories; the good, the funny and, yes, the sad, too. The laughter ultimately took the place of our grief and we realized that was important to do. My advice: share your hearts and, that way, the person you are missing really is with you and always will be. Love is too precious not to share."

Shellia Transue passed away on May 13, 2016, just five days after Mother's Day, leaving behind her five children and many grandchildren. Crystal Copeland of Colorado, Amanda Vanage of Pen Argyl, Trisha Liiro and Freddie Boettinger of Bangor, and Sarah Hillegass of Kunkletown, reflect on the loss of their mother.

"One thing I remember about my mother is that she was always there. I could go off no matter what my age, and when I came back she was there. It was not until I was older and had my own children that I fully felt the impact of her being there. Now I think I can feel some of the same things she experienced each time we left the house. Little did we know the anxiety she must have felt, wondering where we were and what we were doing. So now we do not have the physical being, but we have what she gave to our souls. We gained so much strength and knowledge and experienced so much through her interests. I miss the essence of my mother. It is up to us, her children and grandchildren, to carry this on, because if we do this, then she will always be there."

For Bereaved Mothers

Liz Ruggiero of Roseto lost her daughter, Gina Jennings, to cancer in 2011. This will be Liz's eighth Mother's Day since Gina's passing and it is still very difficult for Liz, as there is no expiration date for grief.

"My time of grieving is not over. It will never be over. The hardest thing I ever had to do was let my daughter go as angels carried her up to Heaven."

Chad Matthew Wagner was only 25 years old when he died of a drug overdose in 2014. The manner of his death made it that much harder for his loved ones, particularly his parents, Mitchell and Karen Wagner of Bangor. Upon her sixth Mother's Day since Chad's passing, Karen reflects on the loss of her son.

"My son died; my relationship with him did not. I also tell myself that I could not control my son's choices. He was an addict, but those who truly knew him, knew he was so much more than [that]."

For Lisa Rigione of Bangor, this will be her fifth Mother's Day without her son, Mike DeBiase.

"I would say 'Happy Mother's Day,' but it's not. If this is your first or your 50th, if you never got to hold your precious little one or if they were with you for 75 years, I am so sorry. My heart breaks for you.

"Be gentle on yourself. Stay in bed if you need to. It's okay to cancel plans. It's okay to have fun and smile! Mention their name[s] even it makes others uncomfortable.... Do what you need to do for you. I write on Mikey's Facebook wall everyday.... it makes me feel connected [to him].

"You will want to and wish to be with your child, even though you have more children. I used to feel extremely guilty for that, but it is very common--most of the moms of angels I know all have similar thought and feelings. You will feel guilty sometimes when you are having fun, even if it is just for a moment.

"Don't force yourself to do things because you feel obligated.... Cry when you need to, as often as you need to! Some days, just getting out of bed is an accomplishment. It's all okay.

"I have found my biggest support in other grieving moms because no one understands; even if they try to, they can't.... Join a support group if you need to."

Whether it is your mother or a child you are without this Mother's Day, I hope you have taken solace in the words of those who have experienced this same sorrow. This Mother's Day, let us recognize all mothers and all the different ways in which the day might be spent.

"I love the fact that we had such a huge platform to be able to talk about fostering," Jennifer said. "It was great to be able to open people's eyes and see what fostering is all about and to see that we're not some special family that has anything more than any other family has to offer."

On the episode, titled "Family Time in Thailand," Jeff and Jennifer travel to Thailand with three of their seven children, daughters Hannah, Harper, and Havyn, ages 13, 15, and 18. While in the Southeast Asian country, the Steeles explore the historic town of Ayutthaya and tour the ruins of an ancient temple. They also visit an elephant sanctuary, where they learn the difference between Asian and African elephants. pound ground beef
can (16 ounces) refried beans
1/4 cup chopped onion
package taco seasoning
can (8 ounces) refrigerated crescent rolls
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
2 cups shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
chopped green pepper (optional)
shredded lettuce (optional)
chopped tomatoes (optional)
sliced ripe olives (optional)

Heat oven to 350 F. In large skillet over medium heat, cook and crumble beef until no longer pink; drain. Add beans, onion and taco seasoning.

Unroll crescent roll dough. Press onto bottom and up sides of greased 13-by-9-inch baking dish; seal seams and perforations.

Spread beef mixture over crust; sprinkle with cheeses. Bake, uncovered, about 30 minutes until golden brown. If desired, sprinkle with green pepper, lettuce, tomatoes and olives.
