Easter: There is No Better Time for Renewal and Hope

It is Spring, and there is something special about this time of year. We see symbols of growth everywhere.

The branches on the trees are starting to bud. We plant tiny seeds beneath the soil and watch them blossom as countless varieties of flowers in the world all reach towards the sun to grow. Birds gather twigs, building their nests. There is a feeling of hope as we experience longer days of light and sun.

Spring also brings the quintessential Spring celebration, Easter. There are many traditional ways we celebrate Easter. We decorate eggs, enjoy Easter egg hunts, attend Easter parades, and fill baskets with special treats and surprises. We gather with family and friends, often wearing new clothes with spring colors, as we enjoy a festive meal together.

These traditions that we celebrate year after year become woven into our family fabric. However, we should not lose sight of the true significance of Easter. It is a celebration of renewal – the triumph of life over death and the promise that comes with it.

Jesus was crucified and died. Three days later, He rose from the dead, proving His divinity. His victory over death offers us hope and a path to salvation and eternal life.

Easter is a time for Christians to reflect on the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection and to celebrate the promise of new life in Christ. It is a demonstration of God's dynamic power and love. Sin is conquered, allowing for reconciliation with God. This is the foundation of Christian faith.

So much has been written in the Gospels about Christ's death, but what can we learn from Christ's example during the events of Holy Week – the week leading up to His crucifixion, death, and resurrection?

Jesus' life on Earth was filled with His teachings and examples of His love and faithfulness to His Father. Holy Week is an opportunity to journey with Jesus, witnessing not only the final days before His death but also the depth of His humanity.

His love for us is reflected in each step toward the cross and His resurrection. It depicts the struggles He faced and the fulfillment of many biblical prophecies.

Holy Week is the most sacred time in the Christian calendar. It is a time of deep spiritual reflection, reminding believers of His journey of love, suffering, and redemption for all of God's children.

Beginning with Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter, we can reflect on what Jesus was experiencing. Religious leaders would ruthlessly act on their jealousy. His own followers would desert him and one would betray him.

Jesus put aside his human emotions and fulfilled the will of His Father. He showed how to blend gentleness with courageous strength. How can these events shape and direct our own lives?

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where cheering crowds greeted him with palm branches.

Jesus knew ahead of time what the week would bring, He knew some in the crowd would soon shout for his death, and He accepted it with grace and purpose. Jesus showed us His humility as he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey.

Although His initial joyful reception contrasts with his subsequent suffering and crucifixion, His love for God's people and His commitment to His Father's will is a reminder of Christ's obedience to His Father.

Palm Sunday's events remind us to open our hearts to Jesus and actively commit to following Him, embracing his teachings and purpose in our lives.

Holy Week reminds us that our faith should be unwavering, not just during times of joy and celebration, but also when faced with

trials and tribulations.

On Monday of Holy Week, Jesus continued His journey toward the cross but with authority and a mission.

He confronted the corrupt practices in the Temple. He drove out money changers who were exploiting worshipers. He also performed miraculous healings, embracing His desire to help and heal. Jesus knew the need for true worship and our need for healing.

Holy Tuesday was a busy day for Jesus and the disciples. Jesus taught and preached extensively. His authority, allegiance, and beliefs were questioned by the priests. He called them out as he spoke of the lessons of faith and of love – the greatest of gifts.

That night a woman anointed Jesus with oil, and He responded with gratitude for her tender love and care.

Let this day be a reminder of who and what we are most grateful for in our lives. How often do we express our appreciation for people and our experiences? What joy would we have in our lives if we lived each day from the perspective of gratitude?

Holy Wednesday, also known As Spy Wednesday or Silent Wednesday, was a day of reflection at the home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. Jesus anticipated the days ahead, knowing soon everything would change. It was also a day of turmoil. This is the day Judas Iscariot began plotting to betray Jesus.

Holy Wednesday reminds us of the importance of reflecting on our own relationship with God and the moments of quiet and solitude in our lives.

It is also significant for us to consider our own choices and avoid becoming entangled in situations that could undermine our integrity. We must recognize the importance of choosing love and compassion over greed and betrayal.

On Holy Thursday, or Maundy, (Maundy means commandment) Thursday, Jesus and His disciples shared their last meal together. At the Last Supper, He washed the feet of His disciples.

After the meal, some of His disciples accompanied Him to the Garden at Gethsemane. There Jesus prayed. His agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, on the night before His arrest and crucifixion, is the perfect example of Jesus following God's will.

He experienced intense anguish and He prayed that, if possible, His suffering would be removed.

Under the weight of unimaginable agony, He still chose the cross, trusting in His Father's plan and love. He embraced His divine calling. He submitted to God's will.

There He taught His disciples – and us – what to do when we come to the end of our own strength and need God's help.

Jesus gave His disciples a mandate, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." John 13:34. We all have known periods of loss and disappointment in our lives. We've had to face situations that can seem unworkable and have become discouraged.

At these times, we can lean on our faith. We don't have to face challenges alone. Our true strength comes from relying on God's power when we feel vulnerable.

Like Jesus, we can trust in God's unwavering support because His strength is more than enough. We can lift our heart to the blessings around us, even when we feel lost and alone.

Psalm 34:18 states: "The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit".

Good Friday was the last day of Jesus' life on earth before His resurrection. It was a solemn day. His death was the ultimate act of atonement for our sins.

He was betrayed by Judas and denied by Peter. His disciples

scattered. He was arrested, was falsely put on trial, condemned, beaten, and mocked.

Jesus' death was the most painful experience - physically, mentally, and spiritually - that any human could have to endure. After His death, Jesus was taken down from the cross, wrapped in linens, and placed in a tomb.

Good Friday serves as a powerful reminder of Jesus's sacrifice and His love for humanity. It is the most perfect example of forgiveness, reconciliation, and the courage to confront injustice.

Good Friday encourages us to embody Jesus's message. This reflection helps us to acknowledge the cost of our redemption and the depth of God's love.

Jesus' prayer on the cross was for forgiveness for his persecutors: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Luke 23:34.

The power of His forgiveness encourages believers to seek to love others as Jesus loved them and to make peace in our lives.

It also reminds us that Jesus's sacrifice is essential for reconciliation with God.

On the Saturday of Holy Week, Jesus' body rested in the tomb. His followers were anxious and doubtful, but they waited with hope and faith in the face of darkness and uncertainty.

We, too, need to trust that even in times of grief, loss, and waiting, there is always a promise of new life and hope.

When we reflect on Holy Week and its significance, we can chart a direction for our lives that can be hopeful despite the situations that confront us.

At these times, we can lean on our faith. We don't have to face challenges alone.

Like Jesus, we can trust in God's unwavering support because His strength is more than enough. Faith invites us to trust in God's wisdom even when our questions remain unanswered. It is about finding peace and knowing and loving God.

His abundance arrives just when we need it most, nurturing our spirit and guiding us forward. If we let Him, His presence can fill us with courage.

1 Peter 5:6 states: "Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time". We know that His divine interventions surpasses human understanding and brings triumph over adversity.

One of the gifts of spiritual living is knowing we have the power to choose our responses regardless of what we are experiencing.

God's presence strengthens us when we are weak, discouraged, or feeling hopeless. He leaves us filled with His grace and love.

There is great power in believing. It is how we demonstrate and deepen our faith. As we live our faith, our lives can change from circumstances that once seemed hopeless. Acknowledge His power in your battles. Trust that He is fighting on your behalf and working all things for your good. We can surrender our struggle to Him.

When we focus on the beauty and goodness around us, we find ourselves wrapped in His peace and joy.

We are blessed with God's gifts and earth's beauty - blue skies, oceans, mountains and valleys. They are all part of the interconnected web of life.

Every new moment brings an opportunity for a new beginning. Easter calls us to a new life. Easter is the dawning of hope and the promise of resurrection and new beginnings.

This Easter, and every season of our lives, let us celebrate the victory of divine love and a resilient nature.

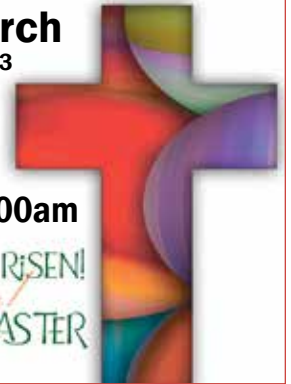
