Northampton Community and Lehigh Carbon Community Colleges, in partnership with PA CareerLink, will offer CNC (Computer Numerical Control) Machining training through a Strategic Innovation Fund grant provided by Workforce Board Lehigh Valley and the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry. Hitting that buzzer sent Day to stage two of the finals, which will air on the season finale of ANW Monday, September 10th at 8pm on NBC.


A 2017 graduate of Bangor Area High School, Zach Day is known as "All Day" on ANW, a competition he

Where Were You When the Towers Fell? By Sarah Janelle Loren



September 11, 2001. Everyone who remembers that day knows exactly where they were and what they were doing when they heard the news broadcast. I was in a classroom, surrounded by scared classmates and concerned teachers, wanting so desperately to be home with my family.

That day was one of the scariest of my life. What was going on? What was terrorism? Why was this happening? So many questions and uncertainties. But then we all came together to comfort each other and stand together, not just as a nation, but as human

beings. We remembered those whose lives were taken in the attacks, and honored those who gave their lives trying to save others'. We swore we would never forget, not just the tragedy of September 11, 2001, but the bond that was born because of it.

Little Creek Bar-B-Cue Co. co-owner, Kim Green, 53, was a ramp supervisor at Lehigh Valley International Airport at the time. She was just arriving to work when the North Tower of the World Trade Center was hit. Within 20 minutes, planes were being diverted to LVIA. Passengers on one of the diverted planes actually witnessed the WTC attack.

"I can't imagine being on an airplane with all that going on," Green said. "When the planes started flying again, we were all so cautious. You just didn't know."

Shortly after the attacks, Delta closed the station in which Green worked. Since then, she has been an airplane passenger and has observed the changes in airport security, as well as the country.

"People become complacent when things go on for so long and nothing happens," Green said. "After the attacks, it didn't matter what color, political affiliation, gender... nothing mattered. You just did what you had to do to help. Why does it take a tragedy for people to remember we're all human?"

US Air Force Veteran, Rob Ealey, remembers, "I was a freshman at Bloomsburg University. I watched live as the second tower was hit. My best friend was greatly concerned for his father's well-being because he worked in New York.

"It was a moment of tremendous tragedy, but at the same time, we all felt an indescribable bond and unification with all fellow citizens. During times like those we are no longer divided by race, gender, religion, political ideology... In that moment, we are simply Americans who are grieving."

Now living in Roseto, 35-year-old Ealey likes "to remember how we all came together, undivided. We must remember that we are all members of the human race... and we need to work to befriend one another instead of continuing to segregate ourselves..."

Bangor Police Officer Michael Hunsicker, 46, was Acting Chief of the Bangor Police Department when the attacks happened.

"My responsibilities were of those I would not have expected," said Hunsicker, who's been an officer for 25 years, 22 of which he has served with the Bangor Police Department. "Being a first-responder was never the same after 9/11. Since 9/11, first responders have become involved in national security."

Another local first responder, East Bangor Volunteer Fire Company Chief Pete Zazulak, was working when he first heard of the September 11 tragedies.

"I was shocked, confused... The whole thing felt like a bad dream. "said Zazulak, 35. "Recently [my family] was at The National 9/11 Pentagon Memorial. There sat a lady crying by one of the name monuments. That's all a lot of people have."

Bangor Area High School graduate Alyssa M., 29, remembers "sitting in my seventh grade pre-algebra class when a teacher came in and told us to put the television on. [Terrorism] was a word that didn't exist to me at that point.

So I remember trying to wrap my head around what that would mean." Alyssa, now living in New York City, went on to say, "My latest reflections of that day don't incite feelings of Patriotism or blind apprehension against people whose beliefs differ from mine. It's more about the humanity part of it, and why that's the only true currency of strength in a time of devastation.

"The collective gasp or sigh in a classroom full of shocked preteens. The tears and embrace shared between strangers from different countries and backgrounds watching an attack take place blocks from them. That's what lifts and carries you when your world is turned upside down."

my life. What was going on? What was What better way to honor those lost in the cataclysm of September 11, terrorism? Why was this happening? So 2001, than to come together as members of the human race.
