

Lights of Hope

Lights of Hope is a nationwide awareness event started by "The Addicts Mom." This group focuses on the mothers of addicted children.

Penny Conway's son is an addict: He is also 5 plus years clean and recently became a father to a beautiful daughter a few months ago. Penny knows the guilt and shame parents and other family members go through when you have a family member who is an addict. After several years of struggling with feelings of loneliness and desperation, she decided to seek help. The "Addicts Mom" is a 75,000 plus member group that helps parents over come the feelings of culpability. Like grief, there are steps that every parent goes through when they learn that their child is an addict. "The Addicts Mom" helps parents with feelings of denial, shame, and blame.

Penny Conway, is the organizer of this local event. Her goal is to help people understand what addiction is and to help eliminate the stigma that is associated with addiction. She is hopeful that the residents of the Slate Belt and surrounding communities will come to the Lights of Hope event to remember and memorialize their loved ones and friends who they have lost to addiction, those who are still struggling and those in recovery. It is also an opportunity to get informed on the addiction epidemic that affects so many families today.

This year's Lights of Hope event will take place on **Saturday, September** 9th from 5:00 pm-7:30 pm at the William Pensyl Social Hall located at 111 State Street in Portland, PA.

This year's event will feature speakers, Judge Alicia Zito, and Bangor Police Officer Michael Hunsicker will speak about the Bangor Angel Program. Judge Craig Dally is also expected to speak at the event about Drug Court. Two long time recovering addicts will also be on hand to share their stories. A "Drug Drop-Off Box" for legal and illegal drugs and paraphernalia, Northampton County Department of Drug and Alcohol, Bethlehem Health Bureau as well as Voices For Change, Humble Beginnings Recovery Center, Love Stepped In, Drug Free World, Steps To Recovery, Changes On Third, and Celebrate Recovery, are just a few of the organizations that will be at the event. "Hidden in Plain Site" will also be on hand for parents to view.

There will also be activities and crafts for children. They will be able to sign a "drug-free pledge".

The Real Estate Guys "Flipping Real Estate"

There isn't a day that goes by when we don't get a visitor or calls from individuals stating that they are investors looking for "flip properties". Some actually are investors and flippers. They actually have experience, available funds, and are ready to pounce on the next opportunity that comes on the market. Most callers, in reality, are those who have watched one of the

too many flip shows on TV and believe, for some reason, that they can do what the actors are doing.

Flipping can be profitable! Some individuals do it for a living (you will be competing with them). It is not as easy as it looks. I personally have "flipped homes" since the 1980's when it didn't even have a name. In recent years I have chosen to work in conjunction with several clients as their Realtor rather than competing with them.

If you are serious about flipping some important considerations must be considered.

1. You will need money! If you don't have your own money available, you should get approved by a lender who will finance this type of investment. They are rare and will charge up to 4% (points) of the loan as well as 10% to 18% interest. Make sure they will also lend the money needed for improvements. Consider that a successful flip should take about 6 months. During that time you will be paying for taxes, interest, insurance, maintenance, and utilities. In addition, the largest costs will be the materials and contractors costs for making the improvements.

MAKE SURE... that you have the funds available! When a flip property comes available it will sell immediately. The Seller will want proof of funds right now... not "don't worry, I can get it"

Let me reiterate: YOU MUST HAVE MONEY READILY AVAILABLE!

- 2. Look for properties in desirable locations and priced at a point where there is an opportunity to profit. For example, if the homes in the market around the property are selling for \$ 125,000 and you can buy a home for \$ 60,000 it sounds like a good deal. Consider your buying and selling costs, your rehab costs, carrying costs, and taxes on the profit. If all of these come to \$100,000, and you can make \$25,000 by selling around \$125,000, then consider it a reasonable opportunity. Keep in mind as nice as you make it, the market (and Appraisal) will hold the price around the market average.

 3. Unknowns will come up. Obviously, the properties that are bought for flipping are in some type of distress. Even a thorough inspection cannot determine surprises. Bringing it up to code can be expensive. As in a recent case the oil burner needed substantial repair...it meant a \$1000 bill that was not planned. A bad septic or well could easily sink your project. You could run into lead pipes, knob and tube wiring, and numerous other unforeseen costs. Before you can begin you will have to clean it out... several dumpsters could cost \$3000 (including labor).
- 4. Now you are ready to begin. Established contractors and others who are able to do the work themselves have a tremendous advantage over those who must hire others to do the work for you. It also helps if you know where to find deals on the products that you will need. The most money made with a flip is made with 'Sweat Equity" ... that is the money earned, or saved by performing the work yourself. By the way... do not forget to get the proper permit from the municipality that the property is located in. In most areas you will have to have a code inspection conducted prior to selling.
- 5. Be selective to the improvements that you will make. A flip usually involves considerably more than painting and putting new carpeting in. Buyers have come to expect a renewed condition when they buy a flipped home. That does not mean, however, it has to have granite counters, custom fixtures, etc.
- 6. Now that you are ready to cash out, make sure you list your project with an experienced Realtor. Any hic-cup will cost you time...and money. Several mortgage related rules are in place that you should consider. For example, you cannot enter into an Agreement to sell this property with an FHA buyer until 90 days after the deed has been recorded. In some areas, if the transaction will close within 6 months of the date that your deed was recorded, two Appraisals will be required by the mortgage company (you usually will be paying for one of them).

You get them in the mail...Ads on TV..."COME TO OUR FREE WORKSHOP" ALL of these "programs" that are offered are designed to sell you services. I am aware of one group in Bethlehem who paid \$40,000 to join a group. I believe they were disappointed. Flipping is work, but not rocket science. You will be able to figure things out with help of professionals in related fields.

In closing, "Flipping Homes" can be a reasonably profitable business. But it really is not for everyone. It is a business! There are risks and rewards.

BACK TO SCHOOL PREP

Summer is just about over and that means it's back to school time. As a mom of a kindergartner and a 3rd grader, I have been getting ready the past couple days. I will share with you some tips to help you get ready for back to school crunchy mom

Wait to buy new clothes until after labor day and take advantage of the sales. Some of the younger kids won't care and you can use that extra money for some essential oils or yoga classes.

Children need anywhere between 9-11 hours of sleep depending on their age. With technology, it's getting harder for kids to wind down and go to bed. Bright screens from televisions, computers, tablets, and phones suppresses our body's production of melatonin. Melatonin tells your body that it is night, helping to make you sleepy. Turn off all electronics at least one hour before bed and turn down the lights. To help relax and wind down even more, diffuse an essential oil such as lavender, roman chamomile or cedar wood. You may also apply diluted with coconut oil to the soles of the feet. You may also supplement melatonin 30 minutes before bed. I would start with .5mg. Although melatonin is natural always consult your doctor. It is seriously my best friend. My kids are night owls.

For those of you that pack your kids lunch and snacks I highly recommend buying a bento style food container that neatly divides their meal. This type of container has 3 or more separate sections where you can add different food without it getting mixed together. My 8-year-old get's one for his snack and one for his lunch. I also recommend investing in a quality reusable drink container that is free of BPA and harmful toxins preferably a stainless steel one. You will be saving money by not buying ziplock plastic bags and juice boxes. Most importantly you will be reducing waste and helping the environment.


Lice break outs are real and hygiene has nothing to do with the spread of lice. They tend to happen at school from direct contact with another person with lice. See below my hair conditioning spray recipe that ALSO keeps the bugs away, including lice. If your child does get lice one day please don't buy those chemical laden lice shampoos at the drug store. Add a couple drops of tea tree oil (depending on the child's sensitivity) to enough olive oil to saturate the hair. Massage well and cover with a plastic bag. Leave as long as possible or overnight. Remove the bag and use a lice comb to remove the dead lice and nits. Wash hair well with shampoo and repeat daily for a week.

In an 8oz glass spray bottle add 2-3 pumps of your favorite non-toxic hair conditioner. Add 20 drops tea tree oil, 15 drops rosemary oil, and 15 drops lavender. Fill with distilled water, shake well and spray roots to ends. This spray works great at detangling and adding shine to my 3 year old's hair. This spray will also promote hair growth, soothe itchy flaky scalp, and of course, keeps the pests away.

You can always add that little bit of sweetness in the snack area to keep kids happy. And who doesn't love cake turned into a simple cookie?

This is the best combination, cake batter chocolate chip cookies! They

are the only reason you'll ever catch me buying a boxed cake mix! They're so easy to whip up and they freeze well too, so they'll stay fresh if you only want to use a small amount at a time.



Cake Batter Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

1 1/4 flour 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 1 1/4 cup dry yellow boxed cake mix 1/2 teaspoon salt 3/4 cup butter, softened to room temperature 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar 1 egg

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract 1/2 cup sprinkles 1 cup chocolate chips (I used 1/2 cup of white and 1/2 cup of semisweet chocolate chips)

Directions:

In a large bowl, sift together flour, cake mix, and baking soda. Set aside. Using a hand mixer or a stand mixer fitted with paddle attachment, cream the softened butter and both sugars together on medium speed until smooth. Add the egg and mix on high until combined, about 1 minute.

Add the vanilla and beat on high until combined. Add the flour mixture to the wet ingredients and mix on low-medium speed until just combined. Add the chocolate chips and sprinkles. Mix on low until the add-ins are evenly disbursed.

Cover tightly with plastic wrap and refrigerate dough for at least 2 hours, or up to 3-4 days. This step is what makes the cookies so great, I suggest always chilling cookie dough in advance to baking them.

Once the dough is chilled, preheat oven to 350°F. Line two large cookie sheets with parchment paper. Scoop rounded balls of the cold dough onto an ungreased baking sheet, use about 1.5 Tablespoons of cookie dough per cookie. Bake for 10-12 minutes until lightly browned along the edges. Let cool on pan for 5 minutes then move to a wire rack. You can freeze the cookies after completely cooked for maximum freshness. Enjoy!freshness. Enjoy!

Local Animal Groups Pull Together to Rescue Over Eighty Hoarded Cats

A startling example of cat hoarding in Henryville, PA., brought local rescues and shelters together to evacuate eighty plus cats. Officials from AWSOM Animal Shelter, Camp Papillion, and NEPA Animal Adoption Network responded last week, answering the desperate call of a cat lover who found herself in over her head. In just two short years an adopted female named Mimi and an unaltered male produced a hoard of 80 cats which took over the small home. Crawling through deplorable conditions, volunteers responded with gloves, masks and cat crates in an effort to round up as many felines as possible. AWSOM rescued 21 adult cats, including Mimi, all of whom are super sweet despite their ordeal. All cats have received vaccinations, baths and have been spayed or neutered in preparation for adoption. This cautionary tale illustrates the need to spay and neuter family pets and feral cats before populations spiral out of control. Why Everyone Should Plan for Long-Term Care

(Family Features) Research suggests that most Americans turning age 65 will need some form of assistance with everyday activities, known as long-term care, as they grow older. The amount of care needed will depend on many variables, including overall health, cognitive functioning and home environment.

Age is a strong predictor of the need for help, and because women live longer on average, they are more likely than men to require long-term care. Factors such as a disability, injury or chronic illness also increase the chance that long-term care will be needed.

Three simple steps can help you start planning for care you may need as you age.

1. Know what to expect

Most people know they should save for retirement, but many don't know exactly what expenses to expect. An often overlooked area is long-term care, a broad set of supports for everyday tasks like dressing or eating. While most of this care is provided by family members and friends, sometimes older adults and their families get these services from providers like home health aides, area agencies on aging or residential providers such as assisted living or nursing homes.

Understanding long-term care is the first step in creating a plan. Key things to know include:

- * A person who lives alone is more likely to require long-term care than one who can rely on a spouse or partner for help with daily tasks.
- * Long-term care is expensive and represents a major uncovered risk to your retirement savings.
- * Medicare does not pay for long-term care services or supports with some minor exceptions. Neither does your employer-based health insurance or Medigap.
- * Most people prefer to receive long-term care at home; their odds of doing so may be improved by making home modifications to reduce the risk of falls.
- * Many Americans say they do not want to rely on their children for care, but a lack of planning for paid care often leads to exactly that result.

2. It's not just about you

A choice to plan or not plan will likely have a big impact on family and friends who may also be informal caregivers. Statistics show that most long-term care is provided by family members or other loved ones.

Take the time to make clear your preferences for what kind of help you value most and where you want to receive it. Family and friends will feel better knowing that you are thinking about your needs - and theirs - by planning for long-term care.

3. Better active than reactive

Be proactive. Staying at home is great, especially if it has been modified to help you avoid an injury and continue to care for yourself. However, it won't happen without taking steps to ensure you can get the supports you need at home. Start thinking about ways to maintain your independence, safety and care needs.


