The Slate Belt Heritage Center, located at 30 Forth 1st Street, Bangor, Pa, is pleased to announce that it is now accepting applications for its' "Annual Heritage Award". The purpose of the award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed exemplary acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. Candidates may be an individual or group and can be nominated by themselves or by another party.

There will be three (3) categories:

- 1. Initiative Award: Applicant who has performed exemplary actions in promoting and preserving the Slate Belt heritage through in-kind actions. This means acts that do not necessarily involve monetary donations but can be unpaid service for a preservation cause.
- **2. Architectural Award:** Applicant who is saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation.
- **3. Special Focus Award:** Applicant who is saving or conserving tradition or a body of knowledge. That individual who contributes to educational information via exhibits, documentation, internet, archival, etc.

Consideration is given to projects with:

- 1. A specific start and end date.
- Whether the project meets Professionally accepted preservation and/or scholar standards.
- 3. Whether the project is considered "complete" with goals and how they were achieved.
- 4. Whether the project had a significant impact with before and after photographs for proof of information and/or proof that a historic piece would have been otherwise lost if the nominee had not completed the project.

Nominations will be accepted this fall and will be reviewed in January of each year. The awards will be presented at a special program in June. One prize will be awarded with the possibility of one per category depending on committee's review of candidates. Nominations should include a description of entry, photos (if applicable), and any pertinent documentation. The Heritage Center retains the right to exhibit and/or publish the application materials, including photographs. Applications for those not chosen will be held on file, indefinitely, for future consideration.

#### Sen. Rafferty, Sen. Scavello: Veterans Organizations Now Exempt from Realty Transfer Tax

Nationally recognized veterans organizations are now exempt from the Realty Transfer Tax, under a provision sponsored by Sen, John Rafferty (R-44) and Sen. Mario Scavello (R-40).

Prior to the change, veterans organizations wishing to transfer property from the local home association to the post were not excluded from the 2 percent realty transfer tax despite their tax-exempt status. The Realty Transfer Tax exemption was introduced by Senator Rafferty and Senator Scavello asSenate Bill 430, which was amended into Act 43 of 2017, the Tax Code bill.

The change was made necessary as the result of a 1998 state Supreme Court ruling that prompted American Legion home associations which did not have a liquor license but wished to obtain one to apply as an incorporated unit of a national veterans organization. The associations were advised to transfer all other realty and assets to the post to insulate the post and its assets from liability while still affording them the opportunity to have social or associate members who can contribute to the post's financial success.

The new law exempts veterans organizations from the Realty Transfer Tax during such necessary transactions.

"For organizations serving Pennsylvania's veterans, covering costs is a constant challenge. The last thing government should be doing is imposing burdens that divert funds away from services for veterans," Scavello said. "Other tax-exempt entities are excluded from the Realty Transfer Tax, and now organizations that serve veterans will receive the same treatment."

"Implementation of this tax exemption will be especially beneficial to the many smaller social clubs affiliated with veterans organizations. For them, the Realty Transfer Tax is a costly impediment to performing a simple transfer of real estate," said Rafferty. "These organizations tend to operate on very thin financial margins, and now they can spend more of their funds on matters important to veterans, rather than this on tax bill."

Despite the change in tax status, the home association is still dependent on the national veterans organization post, and the post continues to have the authority to disband the home association at any time.

In order to receive a scheduled screening appointment, the completed registration packet, with all mandatory documents, need to be returned to Mrs. O'Brien at Washington Elementary School or Mrs. Kelton at Five Points Elementary School no later than March 2nd.

#### **Medical Information:**

As part of the registration process, parents must present copies of their child's state-issued birth certificate, proofs of residency and clearly documented copies of physician or clinic record of the following immunizations:

- 4 doses of tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis\* (1 dose on or after the 4th birthday)
- 4 doses of polio (4th dose on or after 4th birthday and at least 6 months after previous dose given)\*\*
- 2 doses of measles, mumps, rubella\*\*\*
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) or evidence of immunity
- \*Usually given as DTP or DTaP or if medically advisable, DT or Td
- \*\*A fourth dose is not necessary if the third dose was administered at age 4 years or older and at least 6 months after the previous dose

\*\*\*Usually given as MMR

#### **Transportation:**

Bus stops are assigned based on the established residence with the District. Parents/guardians may request an alternate bus stop for pick-up, drop-off, or both, to accommodate before or after school care. The alternate address requested for a bus stop exception must be within the boundaries of the Bangor Area School District. The request must be for the duration of the school year and on the same bus and bus stop every day.

#### Screening:

Upon completion and return of the registration packet, parents/ guardians will be given a date and time for a screening appointment. Kindergarten screenings for the 2018-2019 school year will occur March 19th — March 22nd at Washington Elementary and Five Points Elementary Schools. All screenings will be by appointment only. An adult must accompany the child(ren) for the screening appointment. Our kindergarten staff is so eager to meet and work with the incoming kindergarten students during these appointments!

In order to make the transition to kindergarten as organized as possible, timely registration is vital. We look forward to seeing all of our upcoming kindergarten parents starting February 1, 2018 as they begin to register their children for kindergarten! Together, we can make the transition to kindergarten a positive experience for our students!

#### School Property Tax Elimination Update from State Senator Mario Scavello's Office

I want to provide constituents of the 40th Senate District with the latest update regarding the school property tax elimination fight in Harrisburg and what to expect in the near future.

Citizens across the Commonwealth voted November 7th to support the expansion of the state's existing Homestead Exclusion program, allowing for up to 100 percent elimination of school property taxes on owner-occupied homes. Passage of the referendum was the first step in providing this critical elimination.

We now need legislation that provides the revenue for residential school property tax elimination.

I have been working since before the referendum vote with Senate leadership and the Independent Fiscal Office to develop a bill that will provide 100 percent elimination of school property taxes on owner-occupied homes through an increase in the state personal income tax (PIT). My bill does not increase the state sales tax.

While I hoped my proposal would be ready mid-December, we are continuing to verify and finalize the revenue estimates from an increased state income tax to ensure there are no weaknesses in the bill. We have very few opportunities to "get this right," so we must make sure the bill is sound. In the meantime, I have distributed a co-sponsorship memo to my colleagues to gaintheir support for the proposal.

After discussions with Senator Dave Argall, the prime sponsor of The Property Tax Independence Act, I agreed to hold off introduction of the legislation until members of the Senate were polled regarding their support of various elimination proposals.

Because of the limited session days in January, I plan to officially introduce my bill at the end of this month and hold a press conference at the Capitol.

School property tax elimination remains my number one priority and it is my hope that elimination of school property taxes on owner-occupied homes relieves the pain of those on fixed income and moves us toward full elimination proposed under Senate Bill 76, the Property Tax Independence Act.

#### **Tomato Gnocchi Soup**

#### **Ingredients:**

- 4 large tomatoes
- 4 cups fresh baby spinach leaves
- 1 18.7 can tomato basil soup
- 1 14-oz carton vegetable broth
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 teaspoon dried dill weed
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 (16-oz) package gnocchi pasta

- 2. Next, melt butter in 1-quart saucepan over medium-low heat. Mix in flour and salt. Cook and stir until mixture is smooth and bubbly.
- 3. Slowly add milk, stirring constantly, until the mixture boils and thickens. Add in 3/4 cup of the Cheddar cheese until melted. Next. mix in Parmesan cheese, blue cheese and bacon until combined. Pour the mixture over macaroni, stirring until well blended.
- 4. Spoon the mixture into the prepared mini muffin cups. Top with bread crumbs. Sprinkle evenly with remaining 3/4 cup Cheddar cheese.
- 5. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until golden brown. Allow to stand 10 minutes. Remove from pans and serve.




