





Easy Slow Cooker Corned Beef and Cabbage

Ingredients:

- 1 corned beef brisket (3-4lbs)
- 1 onion
- 3 cloves garlic
- 2 bay leaves
- 21/2 3 cups water
- 2 large carrots chopped
- 1 small head of cabbage cut into wedges

Directions:

Chop onion into large chunks and place in the bottom of a 6 gt slow cooker. Top with corned beef and seasoning packet.

Pour water into slow cooker until it almost covers the corned beef, add garlic and bay leaves.

Cook on low setting 8-10 hours.

After the first 3 hours add potatoes and carrots to the slow cooker. Two hours before serving, add the cabbage wedges to the slow cooker.

Remove corned beef from slow cooker and let rest 15 minutes before slicing. Serve with potatoes, carrots and cabbage.
