ATTENTION SLATE BELT RESIDENTS

Green Knights, Synagro, Waste Management

As a person whose family has lived in Pen Argyl their entire lives, I must speak to you in reference to the Green Knight Economic Development Corporation letter dated April 28, 2017, which appeared recently in the Express-Times.

Personally, I do not discredit the work of this group. They have accomplished a lot for our community and deserve credit for the time and effort they have devoted to these positive projects.

My question and concern is addressing the Board's letter that states: "they have conducted significant research and due diligence into this particular use and potential impacts to our community, and they also believe that the representatives of Synagro have been extremely open and forthright with our community about the nature of the facility." (Heat Recovery Center)

I have no confidence in these statements. Waste Management is clearly behind the Synagro deal and pushing hard on the directors to be in favor of it. It is all about money. It's the business they are both in (Waste Management and Synagro). They are salesmen for their cause and paid well to accomplish them, which is business, in the real world whether we like it or not. Maybe the recent resignation of two Board members of the Green Knight Economic Development Corporation reflects my "no confidence" as well.

The treatment of sludge is complicated. Sludge from a community such as Pen Argyl Borough is one type. Now compare that to an urban city with various medical, commercial, and industrial businesses operating which contribute all types of materials to be treated in the sludge process. Obviously, it is much more difficult to filter and far beyond my capability to explain.

Now, let's recognize what the Green Knight Economic Development Corporation Board members are up against, in all fairness to them:

- Heavy pressure for pushing Synagro to the public as a benefit when it is another extension of service to the landfill we already have. We don't need an additional extension of waste services in our community.
- Part-time Board members receiving no salary with no expertise in what they are being sold on, up against, highly paid full-time professional sales and marketing staff with their full focus on getting this approved.
- Meetings held in private where Waste Management and Synagro representatives are part of the "due diligence" and significant research without public attendance is where my confidence in the Board's decision-making is questionable.
- Again, two Board members with strong ties to our community have recently resigned.

I believe that the meeting being held with Synagro, at the Plainfield Township Planning Commission meeting, on June 12, 2017 (if it isn't rescheduled again), will be where the

"Real Due Diligence" is accomplished to find the solid information and the facts the entire community deserves.

Yes, the Green Knight Economic Development Corporation have completed various projects that are beneficial to our community and we are proud of their accomplishments. My brother, Neil, and I worked with them through Carlton Snyder and the rest of the YMCA Building Committee who gave their time to accomplish the goal of building the YMCA for our Slate Belt community. This was the final result of years of work and time started with Judge Leonard Zito (then Attorney Zito's) reference to us, "If you want to build a YMCA, call Harry Smith. He knows Frank Frey, A YMCA lifetime representative who is Harry Smith's neighbor." We met at Detzi's for lunch and four to five years later, Neil and I personally donated the property and building for the YMCA, the Green Knight Economic Development Corporation then brought on their contribution to match the state's grant. Today, the YMCA serves our Slate Belt community like the parks our ancestors gave us 100+ years ago.

We encourage the Green Knight Economic Development Corporation to continue to find more beneficial projects for our community, but not Synagro which would have a negative impact for future beneficial businesses. We don't want to sell our souls to the devil for a "few stinking bucks."

Please show up at the June 12th meeting and you will see all of the reasons why we don't need this in our community.

What is the SLATE BELT HEAT RECOVERY CENTER PROJECT?

Since its formation in 2000, it has always been Green Knight Economic Development Corporation's ("GKEDC" or "Green Knights") intention to find a user for the valuable waste heat created by the ENERGY CENTER's turbines. The Slate Belt Heat Recovery Center is a sustainable, green energy project that will use the waste heat to convert biosolids into a safe, recycled product that can be used by consumers for renewable energy and organic fertilizers.

WHERE WILL THE MATERIAL COME FROM AND HOW WILL YOU KNOW IT IS SAFE FOR USE AS A FUEL AND FERTILIZER?

The material the center will process will come from municipal wastewater treatment plants in Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey. Federal regulations require industrial and commercial wastewater system users to pretreat their wastewater prior to sending it to a municipal treatment plant. This assures that the biosolids produced by municipal wastewater treatment plants is acceptable for use as fertilizer or fuel.

The use of biosolids as fertilizers and fuel has been happening for several decades and has been widely studied by universities across the United States. Hundreds of scientific studies have shown that proper biosolids treatment and recycling is a safe and natural way to clean our water, improve our soils and reduce our waste.





Jacobsburg to Host Special World War II Living History Weekend

Jacobsburg Historical Society (JHS) is very excited to host our second World War II Living History Weekend, June 24-25, 2017. The Boulton Historic Site will be open to the public on Saturday, June 24 from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM and Sunday, June 25 from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM for this very special living history event. There is a nominal charge for adults with free on-site parking. Children 12 and under, JHS members, active duty military and scouts are free. Bring your fathers, bring your sons, or bring your whole family!



This special WWII reenactment weekend is designed to educate the local community about the war, honor our veterans. and provide information for various non-profit veterans organizations and the services they offer. Visitors can tour Allied and German

Camps staffed by reenactors, see period military and non-military vehicle displays, meet and talk to WWII veterans, and shop with vendors. The Pennsylvania Longrifle Museum, one of several historic buildings on the Boulton Historic Site, has a special exhibit of objects from and about World War II that will continue through this event. The permanent exhibit room of the Pennsylvania Longrifle Museum contains a substantial collection of original, hand-crafted Pennsylvania longrifles and items related to the making of longrifles from the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. The Longrifle Museum itself is housed in the historic Henry Homestead, which was initially a log cabin in which the workers who built Boulton in 1812 lived. The Pennsylvania Longrifle Museum will be open for tours from 12 Noon – 4:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday.

Other buildings on the Boulton Historic Site include the 1832 John Joseph Henry House, an ambitious Philadelphia townhouse built on the Bushkill Creek. Five generations of the Henry family lived in this home from 1832 to 1989, filling it with musical instruments, books, tools. paintings, furniture, and numerous other personal belongings. The most

important history painting produced in colonial America, the 1756 "Death of Socrates" painted for William Henry in Lancaster, hung in this home until the Henry family donated it to the Historical Society of Pennsylvania several decades ago. The John Joseph Henry House and



Summer Kitchen will be open for tours on Saturday and Sunday from 12 Noon - 4:00 PM.

Visitors can also see the Nicholas Hawk Gun Shop, an authentic. 200-year-old log cabin gun shop that was moved from its original location in Monroe County and reconstructed on the Boulton campus. Although the structure is only 12 by 15 feet, in it Nicholas Hawk built high-quality longrifles that are now considered works of art.



Hello Belt and Beyond Readers....

Summer is approaching which means family time and of course tons of fresh fruit and the perfect little sweet note to go with it! I have this yummy homemade Angel Food Cake recipe that I'd love to share. Don't be intimidated by it either. I promise once you make it you'll ask vourself why you ever used that silly box mix! So

first off, you will need a dozen egg whites, buy the cheapest eggs, they all whip the same! And yes, cake flour does have a substitute and it's super easy. For 1 cup of cake flour combine 1/4 cup cornstarch and 3/4 cup flour and you have cake flour! I do it all the time.

ANGEL FOOD CAKE

12 egg whites 1 1/2 cups sugar 1 1/2 tsp cream of tartar Dash of salt 1 cup cake flour

1 tsp vanilla extract

The trick to whipping egg whites is to have a super clean and oil free mixing bowl. Combine the egg whites. cream of tartar, and salt. Whip on medium speed until foamy soft peaks form and have doubled in size. It takes

about 3-4 minutes for soft peaks to form. Add 3/4 cup sugar and turn the speed up to high until stiff peaks form, the egg whites should be still when you lift your beaters out. This will take about 3 minutes as well. Turn your mixer on to a lower speed and slowly add the remaining sugar, cake flour, and the vanilla extract. Beat until just combined. And viola you did it!

When it comes to pans, you can play around with it, my favorite twist to this angel food cake is to bake it on a half sheet sized pan lined with parchment paper, bake at 350 degrees for 30-33 minutes or until a toothpick inserted comes out clean. Now this is the tricky part, let the pan cool for about 5 minutes, then grab a nice clean towel and sprinkle about 1/2 cup of powdered sugar on the towel. Don't be scared, now flip the cake over on the towel and gently peel the back of the parchment paper off. Roll the Angel Food Cake towel and all by the shorter side as tight as you can, toss it in the fridge for about 30 mins. Now grab that mixer again and beat 8 oz of lightly softened cream cheese, 1 1/2 cups heavy whipping cream, and 1/2 cup of powdered sugar until smooth. Unroll the angel food cake and spread about 3/4 of the whipped icing onto the cake and sprinkle with your favorite fruits like strawberries and blueberries! You did it before so now gently roll the cake up as tight as you can don't be afraid if some fruit falls out! Top it with the remaining icing and some more fruit for decor! Slice into it and enjoy!

Barbecue Dry Rub Chicken

The sweet taste of maple infused with spicy seasoning will have your quests raving at your next cookout!

Ingredients:

1/4 cup granulated maple sugar 1/4 cup packed brown sugar

2 teaspoons salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

2 tablespoons ground mustard

2 tablespoons onion powder

2 teaspoons garlic powder

1 teaspoon chili powder

1 tablespoon paprika

1 teaspoon lemon pepper

1 teaspoon ground nutmeg

3-4 pounds boneless skinless chicken breasts

1 cup apple cider

Directions: In a bowl mix together the spices and sugars.

Place one chicken breast at a time, into a large plastic ziplock bag. Using a meat tenderizer or rolling pin, slightly flatten the chicken breasts, making them even for cooking.

Place the chicken breasts on a large platter or into a disposable aluminum pan lined with parchment paper. Spoon over the dry rub onto both sides of each chicken breast. Use tongs to turn the breasts. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for a minimum of 1 hour.

Grill on medium to high heat. Turning only once. Cook on both sides about 5-6 minutes, until the chicken is no longer pink in the center. Pour the apple cider over the chicken breasts while cooking. This will caramelize as it cooks, and help to moisten the chicken. Let the chicken rest about 5 minutes before slicing.



Secrets for **Mastering the Grill**



For a main entree, Bayless suggests making meat the star and serving up ribeve steaks marinated in garlic, chilies and fresh lime juice. To cap off the meal, his go-to dessert is grilled cornmeal pound cake, served warm and topped with ice cream, berries or whipped cream.

KILL WEEDS AND REPEL BUGS NATURALLY

Warm weather brings much more than flowers, plants. and green grass. It brings pests to our plants and our body, and weeds to our garden. They are no fun and

quite hard to get rid of. So lets start with the weeds. Most of us have used a very toxic weed killer mostly made up of a chemical called glyphosate. Glyphosate is the same chemical used on GMO crops because they were engineered to resist it so it can kill the weeds and not the crop. This chemical is extremely dangerous to the environment and our bodies. It has been linked to Alzheimers, Autism, and cancer to name a few. So please stop using this chemical that is in pretty much all weed killers. Instead opt for a natural homemade weedkiller that is safe for you and the environment like the one I make.

NATURAL WEED KILLER

- One gallon sprayer found at any hardware store
- 1/2 gallon of white distilled vinegar
- 1 TBS of blue dawn dish detergent
- 1 cup of white table salt

Mix all ingredients in the sprayer and fill the rest of the sprayer with water. Spray on your weeds on a hot sunny day for best results. You can also use all vinegar and no water for an extra strength version. I love this stuff! Check out my Facebook page for before and after photos.

Bugs are annoying to us because they can eat up our plants and bite and bother our skin. Most insect repellants are also toxic but you can very easily make a natural substitution at home.

CRUNCHY MOM'S BUG REPELLENT

- 2 oz Spray Bottle
- Witch Hazel
- Aloe Gel

- Essential Oils of Lemongrass. Citronella, Tea Tree, Peppermint
- Distilled Water

Fill the spray bottle halfway with witch hazel. Add a squirt of aloe gel and 5 drops of each oil. Fill the rest with distilled water and shake well. Test it in a small area of your skin to check for sensitivity. This will moisturize and even disinfect the skin. You can also apply it to your clothing if you are sensitive. Not only does this smell amazing but it will keep bugs away naturally.

Lastly I want to share with you a fruit tree spray I discovered online. I have peach and apple trees in my backyard and I always get pests that eat the leaves and fruit. This spray won't harm the trees, the environment, or our bodies with pesticides. So far so good. I want to share it with you so you can use it on your trees and plants this season.

ORGANIC TREE AND GARDEN SPRAY

- 1 gallon sprayer
- 1 cup vegetable or canola oil
- 1/4 cup blue dawn dish detergent 30 drops peppermint essential oil
- Add all ingredients to the sprayer and then fill the rest with water. Mix well and spray all over the tree leaves and trunk. The vegetable oil suffocates small insects and larvae and prevents infestation. The

soap helps coat the leaves. I spray at night or early morning every 2 weeks. I haven't used this on anything other than my fruit trees so use with caution since other plants may be more sensitive.

Formerly, "55-Alive", the new SMART DRIVER 4 and 8 hour classroom refresher / defensive driving course is designed for qualified drivers 50 and older. There are no tests and membership in the AARP is not necessary. All automobile insurance companies doing business in Pennsylvania are required by state law to give a minimum discount of 5% to all qualified policy holders age 55 and over who take the course. Be sure to first check with your insurance agent or company to make sure you qualify to receive a discount.

All classes are taught by trained, unpaid volunteer instructors. The 8 hour class is given in a two day period in two four-hour sessions, and is required for first timers. The one day 4-hour class is only open to those who provide evidence of taking a class during the last 36 months. A \$20 fee (\$15 for AARP members) is charged for either class. Class size is limited, so advance reservations are advised to assure placement in class. Those completing the course will be issued a certificate which is valid for three years. 


