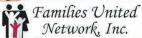

NCC's Center for College and Career Readiness Celebrates Students

Northampton Community College would celebrate GED® recipients during a graduation ceremony in June 2020; however, the COVID-19 pandemic had other plans. Recent events have postponed but will not prevent the Center, staff, family and friends from celebrating the hard work of students. The Center is planning a formal celebration in the Fall to officially celebrate all GED® credential recipients and welcome family and friends to enjoy this moment.

The GED® test is rigorous and tests a student's critical thinking, problem-solving and deductive reasoning skills. Students who have received their GED® credential were required to pass four subject areas - Reasoning through Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Science and Social Studies. This credential is one of the first steps for students in obtaining employment, keeping their job, getting a better job, or advancing to postsecondary education or training.

Currently, 20 students have earned their GED® credential prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, with more students registering to take the GED® test once testing centers reopen. Rising to Challenges in Troubling Times By Kathleen McFall

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused a dramatic upheaval in our lives with changes that were unthinkable at the start of 2020.

Our daily routine has been altered - jobs lost, financial fears and hardships imposed, social isolation, and grief over loved ones lost to COVID-19.

We are now advised to wear masks out in public, practice social distancing, and limit outings to only essential matters. Worry and stress are normal human responses when people are in a state of danger or threat, and this pandemic has caused widespread despair.

Anxiety has grown due to a wide array of concerns, including uncertainty of when normalcy will return and worry about how long the loneliness caused by isolation will continue.

Fighting against an invisible enemy that knows no boundaries, along with fear of a contagion with no known prevention and treatment has generated unprecedented stress. Many of us feel stunned and powerless under these circumstances.

Life is a journey that often can have hardships, but can also be filled with joy and special moments. We can focus on the negative - and let life pass us by - or we can choose to try to make the best out of our circumstances.

How we respond to these challenges can determine the nature of our journey. Often, it is the hardships that, in the end, help to make us more resilient. Our courage and strength are tested as well as our weaknesses and shortcomings.

COVID-19 is challenging our country and the world, but life is about living in the present. No matter how much we plan, we cannot predict the future. The journey itself is life.

Instead of ignoring our present situation and waiting for the future, we should focus on the experiences that we can create within our circumstances. For me, that was FLAG of the Lehigh Valley.

As a co-founder of FLAG-LV, I was fortunate enough to interact with front line healthcare workers and first responders. I witnessed people with incredibly positive attitudes, despite the enormity of their responsibility and the daily danger they face.

FLAG- LV was founded to help restaurant owners who faced a massive income loss when they had to close their doors, and at the same time show support for healthcare workers and first responders facing the stress and uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic.

By paying for meals through generous community donors,

FLAG-LV was able to purchase over 3,000 meals in 10 weeks with donations of over \$22,000 that went right back into the community and local economy.

These meals were delivered to area hospitals, nursing homes, hospital satellite facilities as well as COVID-19 laboratories, EMS, police and fire departments.

As difficult as these times are, FLAG-LV, which is now a national movement that stretches from New Jersey to Hawaii, is a wonderful example of why we should not treat life today as something that we are just getting through on the way to some destination.

Along our journey, we will be confronted with many situations, some will be filled with joy, and some with heartache. We need to embrace our strengths and our vulnerabilities, and let our attitude guide our life's journey.

Yes, this time in modern history is like no other, and we may not be able to control life's trials, but we can control how we face them.

In light of recent COVID-19 Social Distancing Directives, families in need thanks to donations from individuals, the Mt. Pocono Rotary has moved its May, Memorial Weekend Community Aviation Day Fly-In Drive-In Pancake Breakfast to a new date, Sunday, September 6th. of Labor Day Weekend from 8:00am to 2:00pm with this year's proceeds benefiting Mt. Pocono Rotary and the East Stroudsburg Salvation Army. For the past 25 years, this popular community event has been held rain or are donated by event sponsors: Moyer Aviation; Hishine at Pocono Mountains Municipal Airport.

Mark Turner, Event Chair, comments, "Given the uncertainty of whether we could hold our event on Memorial Day Weekend, we have chosen to reschedule this long-standing community fundraiser to Labor Day Weekend. As in years past, the day's events will include a pancake breakfast, airplane and helicopter rides, children's activities, civilian and military aircraft displays, a Huey helicopter, emergency services and antique car displays and if weather permits, a parachute jump." Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$6 for children ages 12 and under. The day's activities include free airplane rides for kids ages 8-17 weather and space permitting. Parking is free.

Turner continues, "This event was created 25 years ago to give residents and visitors to our area the chance to visit the airport, see a variety of airplanes, experience helicopter and airplane rides and generally find out about how to get youth involved with aviation. It has grown to be one of the Mt Pocono Rotary's largest annual fundraisers with over \$200,000 raised and distributed to non-profit and deserving causes throughout the community."

One of this year's non-profits selected to receive funding is the East Stroudsburg Salvation Army. The mission of the Salvation Army is to preserve human dignity while empowering people to reach their potential through honoring heritage, strengthening family values and meeting human needs. In the tough economic times created by this unprecedented pandemic we are now facing, when thousands of neighbors are finding it hard to feed their families, the need for services provided by the East Stroudsburg Salvation Army is under unprecidented pressure.

Last year, The Salvation Army East Stroudsburg Corps. provided 38,939 hot meals; 26,091 food baskets; and 8,983 nights of shelter to Monroe County residents.
