As a single mother battling cancer, Shawn Flyte not only has concerns for her health but she also worries about her children and her final expenses. She does not want to leave her children facing that kind of a burden.



Shawn, a single mother of five, was diagnosed nearly two years ago. with stage 4 lung cancer, that has spread to her lymph nodes and has also gone to her brain.

"It is a rare form of cancer that has the spindle cell characteristics and it runs through the blood stream. If my current treatment doesn't work there are no other options for me." said Shawn

She continues to have a positive attitude and is optimistic about her cancer. She struggles daily not only with her cancer and the side effects



of her treatments but with the grieve of losing a child a few months ago. Shawn's son Kyle, 21, passed away in March of this year. She says "every day is a struggle when you've lost a child. I have four other children that need their mother so I try to remain strong for them."

Shawn started making wreaths as a way to relieve stress and put her worries aside if only for a little

while. She made wreaths for friends and has had requests from people to make wreaths. She recently started making wreaths as a way to supplement her final expense fund. By word of mouth, she has received orders and requests for her beautiful wreaths.

Shawn is determined to beat her cancer diagnosis and stay alive to see her twin sons graduate from high school in 2020 and be around to make a lot more memories with her children.

### Northampton County Begins Partnership with Wildlands Conservancy

Northampton County recently signed a three-year commitment with Wildlands Conservancy to assist the County's Open Space, Parks & Recreation and Farmland Preservation Divisions in trail and greenways development, natural resource protection and restoration, and outdoor recreation programs. Additionally, Wildlands has scheduled more than 50 free environmental education and outdoor recreation programs and conservation workshops this year at several county and municipal parks. These programs and workshops, including children and family programs, youth day camps and paddling adventures, are offered to the public free of charge. The goal of this partnership is to improve the natural resources and quality of life for everyone who lives, works and plays in Northampton County.

The County Parks & Recreation Division manages 18 parks and conservation lands encompassing more than 2,000 acres of green space. Highlighted by the 100-acre Louise W. Moore Park to the 1,200-acre cooperative conservation area surrounding Minsi Lake and the five-mile NorBath Trail, the County has a wealth of resources that can be enhanced for public recreational opportunities. "Of great importance, Wildlands Conservancy will assist in the identification of sensitive environmental areas, and provide guidance on how to best develop public access through trails and environmental education programs," stated Gordon Heller, Superintendent of Parks & Recreation.

In the past five years, Northampton County's Open Space Program has become a leader in the fields of land protection, environmental restoration and trail development. The Open Space Program has assisted funding the preservation of nearly 1,850 acres in open space protection and environmental restoration projects, and over 50 municipal park rehabilitation, development and acquisition projects. The County's land and water trail systems equal nearly 300 miles, with the imminent closure of regional trail gaps, allowing Northampton County to become a major hub for 100+ mile trail systems along the East Coast of the United States.

The Open Space Program recently enrolled Northampton County into the Scenic, Wild Delaware River Geotourism Program (www. scenicwilddelawareriver.com), a nine-county regional tourism effort to highlight outdoor recreation, local towns and small businesses along the Delaware River in Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey. The Geotourism Program is one of 25 internationally that are sponsored by National Geographic.

"The ability to utilize the resources of Wildlands Conservancy will ensure that our parks and natural resources will continue to be utilized in a sustainable manner for recreation and tourism efforts for years to come," said Bryan Cope, Open Space Coordinator and Chair of the Scenic Wild Delaware River Geotourism Stewardship Council.

The Emmaus-based Wildlands Conservancy, whose mission is to protect and restore critical natural areas and waterways within the Lehigh Valley and Lehigh River watershed, has protected more than 54,000 acres of open space, and educated more than 350,000 people since 1973. "The Lehigh and Delaware Rivers and their tributaries, the backdrop of Blue Mountain, working farmlands, numerous nature preserves and area parks are among the special natural features that help define Northampton County's unique sense of place," remarked Chris Kocher, Wildlands Conservancy's president. "Our partnership will build upon our shared successes to ensure conservation and environmental education are among the top priorities of the people who call Northampton County home."

Wildlands Conservancy is currently working with the County to develop a state grant application to address environmental restoration needs at the countyowned Archibald Johnston Conservation Area in Bethlehem Township, and developing plans to naturalize areas in select county parks for wildlife habitat, water quality improvement and public enjoyment.

### Know Before They Grow Weed Prevention Tips for Lawn Care Novices

(Family Features) The old saying goes that "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." If you're new to caring for a lawn, you may not know that this is especially true when it comes to your yard. If left untreated, weeds can weaken or even destroy a healthy stand of grass.

### Start with the basics.

Grow turf that is so thick and strong, weeds can't find an inch to take root by watering and fertilizing properly. Watering too much or too little encourages weeds. Water deeply (6-8 inches) and allow the lawn to partially dry before you water again.

Before fertilizing, read the label carefully to ensure that you have the correct timing. You may also want to conduct a soil test so you know you're applying the correct blend of nutrients for the soil quality in your region. Local cooperative extension offices are useful resources to help you get started.

Also beware of bare spots or parts of the lawn that are not thriving. These areas are an invitation for weeds, so find the cause quickly. Trouble spots can be caused by insects, disease, chemical spills, objects left too long on the grass or broken sprinklers. Once you've resolved the issue, re-seed the area with grass seed that matches the rest of your lawn.

### Mow at the right height.

Grass needs to be the right height to combat the growth of weeds. Grass that is too short exposes weed seeds to sunlight and promotes germination. Ideal blade height varies depending on grass type, time of year and growing conditions, but the most important thing is to never remove more than one-third of the leaf surface at any one time.

In general, cool-season grass, like fescue or Kentucky bluegrass, or grasses in shade grow best when maintained at a taller height, approximately 2 1/2-4 inches. If you have warm-season grass, including zoysia and Bermudagrass, maintain it between 1-3 inches.

### Get tools to help.

Specialized tools and products make it easier to remove weeds. A simple garden hoe can do wonders with young seedlings, and dandelion weeders are perfectly designed to remove deep-rooted dandelions.

### AARP Driver Safety Program

Formerly, "55-Alive", the new SMART DRIVER 4 and 8 hour classroom refresher / defensive driving course is designed for qualified drivers 50 and older. There are no tests and membership in the AARP is not necessary. All automobile insurance companies doing business in Pennsylvania are required by state law to give a minimum discount of 5% to all qualified policy holders age 55 and over who take the course. Be sure to first check with your insurance agent or company to make sure you qualify to receive a discount.

All classes are taught by trained, unpaid volunteer instructors. The 8 hour class is given in a two day period in two four-hour sessions, and is required for first timers. The one day 4-hour class is only open to those who provide evidence of taking a class during the last 36 months. A \$20 fee (\$15 for AARP members) is charged for either class. Class size is limited, so advance reservations are advised to assure placement in class. Those completing the course will be issued a certificate which is valid for three years. 





### CELEBRATE EARTH DAY EVERY DAY By Jackie Talero-Rueda, The Crunchy Mom

On April 22,1970, 20 million Americans took to the streets, parks, and auditoriums to demonstrate for a healthy, sustainable environment in massive coast-to-coast rallies. Since then Earth Day has been celebrated ever April 22. All around the world events are held to support environmental protection. It is a day to salute Mother Earth. Besides planting trees there are many more things we can do to lessen our environmental footprint, not just on earth day but every day.

#### Here are a few. Reduce the use of plastic:

We are obsessed with plastic. It's convenient, cheap and disposable. Although we can recycle it the majority ends up in landfills. Luckily there are great alternatives. Instead of using zip-lock bags for storing food items in the freezer or fridge, use reusable produce bags or

glassware. A quick search of "reusable sandwich and snack bags" will get you a ton of cute and earth friendly products. If using zip-lock type bags try rinsing them out and reusing those. I've gotten a good, 3-4 uses out of them in the past. Plastic wrap is also used way too frequently. I've found silicone suction lids a great alternative to using plastic wrap for storing items in the refigerator. There is also reusable wax wrap made out of beeswax and cloth. It can be used to wrap and store just almost anything. You can make your own or buy it online. Other ways to reduce plastic use is by using reusable shopping bags or totes which are now available at pretty much every retail store. Switch from plastic straws to stainless steel or silicone.

### Reduce the use of paper products:

Like plastic, paper is being used frequently and most often unnecessarily. Paper towels, paper plates, and paper cups especially for coffee, are used constantly and hardly recycled. I've reduced the use of paper towels by keeping an antibacterial towel near the sink to dry hands. I also clean with reusable antibacterial microfiber towels. When going for coffee try to bring your own mug or thermos. Use your regular dishwater when eating at home and wash it in the dishwasher (when full) to save water. **Go Non-toxic:** 

Our homes are filled with harmful toxic products. Making the switch to non-toxic and natural products not only saves our bodies but our environment. All these products are going down the drain or into the air and back into our earth and atmosphere. Use biodegradable scaps, detergents, and cleaners. Stop spraying air fresheners and aerosol hair products. Stop using harmful chemicals to kill weeds and insects and switch to natural ones that work just as well.

I could go on and on with ways to help our earth. Most of it is common sense and most of us know how to. We just need to make the effort and contribute with what we can to love and protect this beautiful world we live on. Enjoy! Jackie
