

#### **Five Tax Tips**

#### Preparing for your Tax Preparation appointment and more. Part 1

1. Many taxpayers have their W2's available on line with access through their home computer or cell phone. Tax Professionals need to keep copies of all pertinent information concerning the preparation of the tax returns and therefore need a paper copy of the information. Most tax professionals have email addresses, so when making your appointment, ask for the tax professionals email address to forward your w-2's. Your tax preparation will then be completed more quickly.

2. If you have dependents, your tax professional is required to retain proof of the qualifying dependents, by having birth certificates and social security cards of the dependents. Also it is advisable to provide other proof like school records, doctor's records or receipts, rental agreements which list everyone that resides in the home, or form 1095 A, B or C, or church records. Make sure that your tax professional retains them in a secure locked location, or secure scanned program.

3. Do you have a dependent who attends college or other qualifying education institution? The student should receive a Form 1098-T. To get a very valuable tax reduction or tax credits, the IRS wants us to have records of payments for educational institution. The 1098-T is not considered to be sufficient information. Students should be able to download last year's payments, whether through loans or out-of-pocket to satisfy the IRS requests. Also to claim books or other required educational tools, the tax professional needs receipts.

4. Interest earned on a checking or savings account is taxable income even if you didn't receive a 1099-INT from the banking institution. No 1099-INT is required to complete your return if the amount is less than \$10.

5. Before you attend your tax preparation interview, think back as to whether you had another job during the year or collected unemployment. Pennsylvania unemployment forms have been mailed but are also available on their website as long as you know your pin number.

#### Senator Boscola Re-appointed Democratic Chair of Senate Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure


