The Slate Belt Heritage Center (SBHC), located at 30 North 1st Street, Bangor, PA will be celebrating its 19th Anniversary of incorporation in conjunction with its' Spring Opening on **Saturday, April 14th.** The Heritage Center is a not-for-profit 501(c) 3 organization whose mission is: To establish and offer for public view and educational purposes: artifacts, displays, DVD's, oral histories, genealogies and research information that reflect local Slate Belt history and heritage, and to perpetuate our Slate Belt Heritage, ethnic contributions, industry and history so that future generations may learn and appreciate our valued past.

The Heritage Center occupies the former 1907 Bangor Town Hall in the heart of the Slate Belt. Displays focus on the lives of people who settled this part of America, from the Lenape to the waves of immigrants-the Scots-Irish, German, Cornish, Welsh, Italian, Jewish and others whose families live here today. The Heritage Center also houses rooms for the textile and slate industries, in addition to the Homefront and Fire rooms.

SBHC presents Preservation Awards to people who preserve Slate Belt heritage and hosts students and teachers ranging from local 4th graders to East Coast Universities. Sen. Boscola Reminds Persian Gulf Veterans to **Apply for Bonus Program**

Sen. Lisa Boscola is reminding veterans of the Persian Gulf conflict that they may be eligible for the Persian Gulf Conflict Veterans Bonus Program.

"I would like to thank our veterans for their service to this country and encourage them to apply for this program," Boscola said. "The bonuses are a way for us to recognize the bravery of these men and women and thank them for vigilantly protecting our freedom."

Boscola said the deadline to apply for the bonus program is August 31. The bonus program, pays \$75 per month for qualifying, active-duty service members, up to a \$525 maximum. For those whose death was related to illness or injury received in the line of duty in Operations Desert Shield or Desert Storm, there is an additional \$5,000 available to the surviving family. Service members who were declared prisoners of war may also be eligible for an additional \$5,000.

Veterans who served on active duty in the Persian Gulf from August 2, 1990 to August 31, 1991 are eligible for this bonus program. They must have served with the U.S. Armed Forces, a reserve component of the U.S. Armed Forces or the Pennsylvania National Guard, Veterans applying must have been a legal resident of Pennsylvania during the time of their active duty and have been discharged from active duty under honorable conditions.

A Pathway to Healing Offering Suicide Support Group to Slate Belt and Valley Children

A Pathway to Healing, a support group for children who have lost a loved one to suicide opens for its second run to local kids.

Beginning in April, and running for six consecutive weekends, A Pathway to Healing Counseling Services, LLC will be offering a suicide support group for children who have lost a loved one to suicide. After experiencing her own loss of a loved one to suicide, which left two of her grandchildren affected, Bernadette M. Gaumer, LCSW therapist and owner of A Pathway to Healing Counseling Services, LLC recognized the void of support for children who have lost a loved one to suicide and has dedicated herself to making a difference.

The support group, which is available at no charge to children aged eleven years of age and older of the Slate Belt and Lehigh Valley region, who have lost a loved one to suicide, will run for six weeks on Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. beginning April 7th at a Pathway to Healing Counseling Services, LLC located at 31 West First Street #1 Wind Gap, PA 18091

The support group aims to address the wide range of emotions kids might feel related to losing a loved one to suicide, including feelings of grief and loss, anger, horror, and even shame associated with the loss.

The primary focus of the support group is to provide these children with a safe place where they can openly and freely express their feelings in order to help the healing process. The first meeting of the group will be for the parents and caregivers of the children to go over the group objectives and outline the overall goals, making the full length of time for this group being a seven-week timespan. The subsequent group sessions will focus on the children and include activities to help them cope with their loss, as well as positive ways to express their grief and coping skills to employ during hard times.

Ideally, Gaumer is hoping to put together and create "healing baskets" for the children who participate in the group — which may include items such as journals, pens, coloring books, and small stuffed animals — to aid in their coping and grief processes. In order to do so, however, Gaumer says that donations for her healing baskets, as well as snacks and/or activities for the children to do during sessions, are necessary in order to provide the best experience that these children could hope to have from this group. Funding for this group is otherwise an out-of-pocket expense for Gaumer, who hopes that community support will help to carry this group on through the future, for as many dren who need.

REAL ID Online Pre-Verification

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) opened online application for REAL ID pre-verification for customers who are interested in obtaining a REAL ID and obtained their first driver's license or photo ID card after September 2003.

"Our goal is to offer REAL ID to our customers in a way that is customer-focused and efficient," said Secretary of Transportation Leslie S. Richards. "We are happy to offer these customers an opportunity to obtain a voluntary REAL ID without having to visit a driver's license center."

PennDOT may already have electronic documents on file for approximately 35 percent of its total customers, individuals who received their first PA driver's license or ID card after September 2003.

Starting March 1, PennDOT began sending postcards to eligible customers inviting them to visit PennDOT's Driver and Vehicle Services website to request that PennDOT confirm their documents are on file. PennDOT customers without internet access may call PennDOT's Customer Call Center at 717-412-5300 or visit a PennDOT Online Messenger (PDF) for assistance with pre-verification.

Once a customer has completed the pre-verification application process, PennDOT staff will review the customer's record and verify which documents are on file. The customer will receive follow-up communication from PennDOT regarding the status of their application. Customers are not pre-verified until they have completed the online pre-verification process and received confirmation from PennDOT that all documents are on file.


If they are, PennDOT will mark the customer's record as "verified," and after REAL ID products are available in spring 2019, the customer can opt into the REAL ID program online, pay the one-time \$30 fee, plus their renewal fee (the REAL ID product will include any time left on the current license plus the period of renewal) and their REAL ID product will be sent through the mail, eliminating any need for this customer to visit a Driver License Center.

If PennDOT does not have all the customer's documents on file, they will receive communication from PennDOT informing them that they will need to bring their REAL ID documentation into any PennDOT Driver's License Center beginning in September 2018 for in-person pre-verification.

REAL ID is optional for Pennsylvania residents. A federally-accepted form of identification (whether it's the forthcoming Pennsylvania REAL ID driver's license or ID card, a U.S. Passport/Passport Card, a military ID, etc.) must be used as identification to board a commercial flight or visit a secure federal building on and after October 1, 2020.

Until May 2017, Pennsylvania law prohibited PennDOT from complying with the federal REAL ID Act. Signed into law by Governor Tom Wolf, Act 3 of 2017 repealed this prior legislation and allowed PennDOT to seek REAL ID compliance. Pennsylvania is under an enforcement extension from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) until October 10, 2018, which means that Pennsylvanians may use their current driver's license or ID card to board commercial aircraft or enter federal facilities that require ID until at least that date. Pennsylvania will continue to apply for extensions from DHS until becoming fully compliant with the REAL ID Act. PennDOT is committed to offering REAL ID products at the customer's option in spring 2019.



Easy Slower Cooker Corned Beef and Cabbage

Ingredients:

- 1 corned beef brisket (3-4lbs)
- 1 onion
- 3 cloves garlic
- 2 bay leaves
- 2 1/2 3 cups water
- 2 lbs potatoes peeled & quartered
- 2 large carrots chopped
- 1 small head of cabbage cut into wedges

Directions:

Chop onion into large chunks and place in the bottom of a 6 qt slow cooker. Top with corned beef and seasoning packet.

Pour water into slow cooker until it almost covers the corned beef, add garlic and bay leaves.

Cook on low setting 8-10 hours.

After the first 3 hours add potatoes and carrots to the slow cooker. Two hours before serving, add the cabbage wedges to the slow cooker. Remove corned beef from slow cooker and let rest 15 minutes before slicing. Serve with potatoes, carrots and cabbage.

Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program Applications Now Available Wednesdays: Mexican Train /LCR 10:00am

State Senator Lisa M. Boscola today announced that applications for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program are now available online and at her local Thursday: Wii Bowling offices. This year's filing deadline is June 30.

"This is an excellent program for our seniors and I encourage everyone to see if they are eligible for this program," Boscola said. "The rebate check goes a long way in providing assistance to those who need it most."

Applicants must apply yearly. The rebate amount is based on annual income and paid property taxes for each calendar year. Individuals eligible for the program include Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with permanent disabilities over the 2/22 Water Colors w/Pam age of 18.

In 2008 Boscola voted for the law that more than doubled the income limit for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program from \$15,000 to \$35,000. The measure also raised the maximum rebate for homeowners and renters from \$500 to \$650. Applicants can exclude half of their income earned from Social Security, Supplemental Security income, and Railroad Retirement Tier 1 benefits when applying for a rebate.

Boscola has also introduced legislation that would freeze property tax rates for seniors, and co-sponsored a bill that would totally shift the school funding burden away from property taxes.
