




Four Bangor Area High School Students Were Accepted Into The Pennsylvania Music Educators Association District 10 Band.

Tackling Medicaid Fraud and Abuse

In an effort to ensure taxpayer dollars are helping people truly in need and not being used fraudulently or misspent, a bipartisan group of lawmakers this week unveiled a comprehensive package of bills to stop fraud and abuse within the state's Medicaid program.

The package of bills is the direct result of a grand jury report on fraud in Pennsylvania's Medical Assistance Program, also known as Medicaid, released by the Office of Attorney General and a report recently released by the

House Government Oversight Committee.

The measures would create a state version of the federal False Claims Act to recoup additional funds from false claims made against Medicaid; require state agencies to assess their program expenditures to determine how susceptible they are to improper payment; create a state-level Do Not Pay system to stop improper payments before they are made; establish requirements for contracts with Medicaid Managed Care Organizations; and increase penalties for fraudulent claims.

Every Medicaid dollar that is improperly spent is a dollar taken away from those who benefit in earnest from the program. I am proud to support these efforts in order to eliminate the waste that results from fraud and abuse of our Medical Assistance Program.
