



VFW and Auxiliary Patriot's Pen Essay Contest

Commander Nick Alfero Jr. and Auxiliary President Deborah Riley of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 739 in Bangor, PA announce the kick off of this year's VFW and Auxiliary "Patriots Pen Essay Competition." Middle school students in grades 6-8 in this area have the opportunity to compete in the VFW's annual essay competition and win thousands of dollars.

Students begin by competing at the local Post level. Post winners advance to District. District winners compete in the state competition. The state winners compete for \$46,000 in awards, and then compete at the National level for \$54,500 in prizes. Students are invited to write a 300-400 word essay on a patriotic theme. The theme for 2020-2021 is

"What is Patriotism to Me?"

Create a typed essay and entry form to submit to their local Post in Bangor. Deadline for student entries is **October 31**, **2020**. Submit applications to VFW Post739, Deborah Riley, 202 Veterans Rd., Bangor, PA 18013

Commander Nick Alfero Jr. of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) post 739 in Bangor, PA has announced the kick off of the annual VFW and its Auxiliary "Voice of Democracy Patriotic Audio Essay Competition." Local high school students have the opportunity to compete for thousands of dollars in scholarships and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Students in Grade 9-12 begin by competing at the local Post level with a deadline of **October 31st**. Post winners advance to District and then the first place District winner advances to the state competition. All State winners receive a four day trip to Washington, D.C. A total of \$152,000 is awarded to national finalist. First place is a \$30,000 scholarship. Annually the VFW provides more than \$2 Million in scholarships. Each year around 40,000 students participate in the competition.

Students must write and record a three-to-five minute essay on the 2020-2021 theme:

"Is This the Country the Founders Envisioned"

Create an audio CD and present their recording, typed essay, and entry form to their local Post in Bangor. VFW Post 739, 202 Veterans Rd, Bangor, PA 18013. 610-588-5555. Deadline for student entries is **October 31, 2020.** Program is open to all regardless of VFW Affiliation or veteran status.



Quiet Valley's Autumn on the Farm

To comply with COVID-19 restrictions Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm will feature four smaller autumn events instead of our usual large Harvest Festival in October. There will be a limit of 250 people on the farm at any one time, with plenty of room to spread out. Masks will be required. Saturday, September 19th will be "Fiber Arts in our Lives" with a focus on demonstrations of spinning, weaving, flax processing, rope making, basket making, quilting and more. From 10am to 4pm; Saturday, September 26th our "Apples King of Fruits" event will naturally feature apples, a favorite fruit of the Pennsylvania Germans used for many delicious desserts among other things. From 10am to 4pm; Saturday and Sunday, October 3rd & 4th is "Country Market Days". There will be folks with flea market stands as well as several Quiet Valley booths. The farm's Timeless Treasures area will be selling vintage collectibles, the Everlasting booth has dried flower arrangements and haloes and at God's Half Acre find canned goods, sauerkraut, gourds, freshly baked bread and more. From 10am to 4pm; no admission. On Columbus Day Weekend, the usual Harvest Festival date, there will be two different themes. Visit the farm Saturday October 10th for the "Farm Animals and their Uses" event and meet some of the animals. Find out how the early settlers made their own cheese, turned horns into cups and crafted tallow candles. On Sunday October 11th it's all about "Natural Fibers & Their Uses". Demonstrators will show heritage craft skills involving various natural fibers. Spinning, wheat weaving, traditional dyeing and bobbin lace are some examples. PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED FOR Oct. 10th & 11th so call the office to reserve a spot, either 10am to 1pm or 2pm to 5pm. Events are Rain or Shine, The schedule is subject to change. Please no smoking, no pets. All funds raised go to support Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm, a 501(c) (3) non-profit, educational corporation. 



Slow Down for School Buses

With some students returning to school for in-person classes, school buses are back on the roads. Motorists, parents and children are encouraged to refresh their memories about how to share the road safely.

Pennsylvania law requires motorists stop at least 10 feet away from school buses when their red lights are flashing and their stop arm is extended. Motorists following or traveling alongside a school bus must also stop until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm is withdrawn. Do not proceed until all the children have reached a place of safety.

Penalties for failure to obey school bus safety laws can result in a \$250 fine, five points on a driving record and a 60-day license suspension.

Parents are reminded to ensure that their children are at the bus stop early to avoid rushing. Students should stay where the bus driver can see them while boarding or exiting the bus.

PA State Senator Mario Scavello Introduces School Property Tax Relief Legislation for Seniors



Senator Mario Scavello has introduced legislation that would provide much needed school property tax relief for senior citizens across the Commonwealth. School property taxes continue to rise at an alarming rate and senior citizens are among our most vulnerable populations, given that they are on

fixed incomes. As has been said before, no tax should have the power to leave you homeless and no citizen should be forced to choose between paying for food, medicine or their school property tax bill.

Senate Bill 1262 and Senate Bill 1263 would provide for a school property tax rebate of up to \$5,000 for all seniors age 65 and older who have an annual household income of less than \$60,000. (Fifty percent of Social Security benefits are excluded when determining income.) The legislation would eliminate school property taxes for the majority of senior across the commonwealth.

I have introduced many school tax legislative measures in my career in both the House and Senate. Most recently, I introduced Senate Bill 805 to provide the revenue necessary to eliminate school property taxes on owner-occupied homes via the homestead exclusion. This legislation followed the Constitutional Amendment question passed by voters in 2017 expanding the homestead exclusion to 100 percent of a home's assessed value. I also remain a co-sponsor of and have previously voted for, legislation that would eliminate school property taxes entirely (SB76).

"This is not the final solution to the school property tax problem that has inflicted years of escalating home foreclosures and rising tax bills on Pennsylvania citizens, but it is progress that is within reach to help the most vulnerable." said Scavello

Bryant is one of the only bestselling authors on economics in the world today who happens to also be African-American. Bryant is also chairman and chief executive officer of Bryant Group Ventures, co-founder of Global Dignity, and chairman and chief executive officer of The Promise Homes Company, the largest for-profit minority-controlled owners of institutional-quality, singlefamily residential rental homes in the U.S.

Exploration of this theme is made possible by an endowment for the humanities established through a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities and generous donors. William Mutimer, associate professor of theatre, is the faculty chairperson for the theme.
