

**32nd Annual Farm Animal Frolic at Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm on May 22nd & 23rd and May 29th & 30th, 2021** Quiet Valley's 32nd annual Farm Animal Frolic is **May 22nd, 2rd and May 29th, 3030, Saturdays 10:00am to 4:00pm, and Sundays noon to 4:00pm.** To folks in the 21st century springtime means warmer weather, flowers blooming and the return of robins. In the early 1800s it meant fresh greens became available, a real treat after a bland winter diet. The kitchen garden was planted with such things as peas, onions, beets and carrots. Chickens started laying eggs again and it was also when the animals on the homestead had their babies. At Farm Animal Frolic we celebrate the

renewal of life that comes with the season of spring.

Meet the baby farm animals up close and personal. See kid goats and lambs frolicking about. If you've ever wonder where the saying "two shakes of a lamb's tail" came from you can see the reason for yourself. Chicks will be peeping away and some will be hatching in incubators



so visitors can watch them crack out of their shells. There will be a new calf for the children to meet and guests of all ages will laugh at the ducklings as they play in the water.

All the mommies of the babies will be on hand as well, keeping a close watch on their young, so folks will get to meet them, too, and learn something about their role on the farm. Our Suffolk Punch draft horses, Jenny and Judy, will take you on a wagon ride to the ice harvest pond and back. In the lower barn make sure to say "Howdy" to the piglets, always a lively bunch.

In addition to the farm animals there are plenty of other fun activities. Twice a day there is a special children's show where youngsters can enjoy puppet shows or storytelling. There are opportunities to play old fashion games, try the Fish Pond or visit our focus area for 2021 which is the "Goat Shed" where folks can learn some goat lore, play a game and make a craft.

Sheep shearing will take place on Saturday May 22nd from 10:30 until all the sheep get a "hair cut". The spinners and weavers will hold a Sheep to Shawl demonstration on the 22nd by taking one of the fleeces and attempt to complete a shawl by the end of the day. Raffle tickets will be sold for the finished shawl with the drawing being held at our Old Time Christmas event. Kathy Uhler, from the Pocono Wildlife Rehabilitation Center, will offer a presentation on local wildlife on Saturday May 29th at 11:30 and 1:30. Some of the Center's residents will be on hand. Children's author, William Spellmeyer will be on hand both Saturdays to share his books with the public and do signings. On Sundays the school marm will offer presentations in the One Room Schoolhouse. The outdoor brick bake oven will be in operation during all four days of the event making homemade bread and cookies.

There is nothing more lovable than baby animals, and adults, as well as children will get a kick out of a visit to Farm Animal Frolic. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn about farms, farm animals and to spend a day in the beautiful outdoors. Social distancing will be practiced and masks are required.

Refreshments are available. No Smoking or Pets. Frolic is held Rain or Shine. The schedule and prices are subject to change. All funds raised go to support the mission of the non-profit farm museum.

Quiet Valley is open in 2021 to the general public **Saturday June 19 - Monday September 6.** Also, on additional spring and fall Saturdays. **St. Luke's 250,000th COVID-19 Vaccination** St. Luke's University Health Network is proud to announce that it administered its 250,000th COVID-19 vaccine on Wednesday, April 21st.

Currently the Network is vaccinating up to 4,000 people a day throughout its 12-hospital system across the greater Lehigh Valley. This approach makes getting the vaccine safe for anyone who experiences an adverse reaction since each hospital is equipped with a fully-functional emergency department. St. Luke's vaccination program, which runs seven days a week, has helped to make Lehigh and Northampton counties among the most vaccinated Pennsylvania counties with populations over 100,000.

"The way to beat this virus is through the herd immunity we can achieve with mass vaccination," said Jeffrey Jahre, MD, St. Luke's Vice President of Medical & Academic

#### Scavello Introduces Legislation to Provide Senior Citizen Property Tax Relief

Senator Mario Scavello (R-40) has once again introduced two measures to provide much needed school property tax relief for Pennsylvania senior citizens.

"Property taxes continue to rise at an alarming rate and senior citizens are among our most vulnerable populations, given that they are on fixed incomes," Scavello said. No tax should have the power to leave you homeless, and no citizen should be forced to choose between paying for food, medicine or their school property tax bill."

Senate Bill 590 would provide a property tax rebate of up to \$5,000 for all seniors age 65 and older who have an annual household income of \$60,000 or less. This legislation expands upon the existing Property Tax Rent Rebate Program.

To fund this tax relief, Senate Bill 591 provides for a one-half percent increase in the sales and use tax. This legislation does not expand the sales and use tax to other items -- all currently taxable items would remain the same.

Senator Scavello sponsored similar legislation in the previous session and has fought for the complete elimination of school property taxes.

"I will continue to fight for total elimination of school property taxes. Implementation of this legislation is a necessary step in confronting the property tax structure that has afflicted us with years of escalating home foreclosures and rising tax bills across the Commonwealth," Scavello said.

Headlines Harrisburg Submitted by Rep. Joe Emrick (R-Northampton) Be on the Lookout for Ticks

With the arrival of warmer weather comes more time outdoors and a greater risk of being bitten by a tick. Blacklegged ticks, also known as deer ticks, are the most common carrier of Lyme disease and Anaplasmosis. Ticks typically thrive in tall grass, brush and wooded areas, but deer ticks have been found in every county in the Commonwealth and can live in any habitat.

Common signs of a tick disease include fever, headache, chills and muscle aches. Lyme disease is often characterized by a bullseye-like rash, although Lyme disease may not always present itself with this obvious sign. If you believe you have been bitten by a tick, it is important to speak to a doctor immediately. **To help reduce your risk while enjoying time outdoors:** 

• Cover exposed skin with lightweight and light-colored clothing.

• Avoid tick-infested habitats such as areas dense with shrubbery or tall grass.

- Use an insect repellent containing 20% or more DEET.
- Once returning home, immediately check yourself,
- children and pets for ticks.

• Take a shower immediately to remove ticks that may be attached to skin.

• If possible, dry clothing and gear in a dryer to kill any ticks.

#### Important Information About May 18 Ballot Questions

In just a few weeks voters will head to the polls for the May 18 primary election. There will be more than just candidates on the ballot, as four questions – three constitutional amendments and one referendum – are slated to appear as well.

Please take a moment to learn more about these questions and make sure your voice is heard.

**Questions 1 and 2**: Emergency Disaster Declarations The first two questions propose amendments to the state Constitution that would alter the way state leaders handle future disaster emergency declarations. I voted to put these questions on the ballot because I believe they will restore the foundational system of checks and balances that has been missing over the past year during the COVID-19 pandemic and ensure you, the people, have a voice in how we deal with similar situations in the future.

**Question 1** asks if the General Assembly, by majority vote, should be authorized to end a disaster emergency declaration without a governor's approval.

**Question 2** asks if a disaster emergency declaration should be limited to 21 days, unless a majority in the General Assembly votes to extend it.

#### Question 3: Protecting Rights

This question addresses the Declaration of Rights section in the state Constitution and asks voters if it should be amended to specifically prohibit the denial or limitation of a person's rights based on race or ethnicity.

This proposed amendment would signify that freedom from discrimination based on race or ethnicity is an essential principle of liberty and free government. It would apply to all state, county and local governmental entities in the Commonwealth, and would guarantee equality of rights under the law.

#### Question 4: First Responder Funding

This question does not seek to amend the Constitution but instead asks voters to weigh in on whether an existing loan program – approved in a previous statewide referendum – can be expanded to include municipal fire departments and ambulance companies that are staffed with paid personnel rather than volunteers. Since its inception in 1976, the Volunteer Loan Assistance Program (VLAP) has provided more than \$519 million in low-interest loans for the Commonwealth's volunteer emergency services community.

The referendum was included in a bill I supported to strengthen fire and emergency medical services in Pennsylvania that was signed into law last year. Act 91 of 2020 also made other improvements to grant and loan programs, and designated funding to support recruitment and retention of personnel.


