Community Volunteers Receive Awards from Grand Central Landfill

Grand Central Landfill's Habitat Team recognized a dozen volunteers from the Slate Belt for their dedication to conservation and the environmental education of the youth in the community.

The volunteers included scout troop leaders. butterfly experts and bird specialists. Each received an engraved trophy or plague honoring their work, other treats, and a dinner with friends.

"It is important to celebrate these milestones."

said Landfill District Manager Ron Myer. "Our volunteers continue to hold us accountable for wildlife conservation and guide us on the best practices to employ to benefit wildlife"

The milestone dinner marked is the 10th anniversary of the landfill's Wildlife Habitat Council certification. Many of the volunteers have been supporting the landfill's efforts since the inception of Grand Central's nest box project.

In 2005, field technicians saw the potential for placing bluebird boxes around the site and received encouragement from former District Manager Scott Perin to proceed with the project. That year, the team installed nine nest boxes. Nearly 60 bluebirds and tree swallows, both colorful, insect-eating species, fledged the boxes in the first nesting

From that point on, the wildlife habitat management plan dramatically changed into a well-thought, aggressive plan focused on utilizing the site's resources to benefit native wildlife species and to promote environmental education.

The habitat projects have grown from a small nest box project to a full-fledged bird monitoring program that includes bird banding of American tree swallows, eastern bluebirds and American kestrels. A local, federally certified bird bander assists the team with banding birds each summer.

The heart of Grand Central's habitat project is a 24-acre warm season grassland. Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Education Specialist, Rick Wiltraut, who has been assisting the habitat team from the beginning, hopes the landfill's work, grassland and other land conservation efforts in Northampton County will result in the return of the barn owl to the area.

"We haven't seen any Barn Owls in the last 10 years, but we hope to soon," said Adrienne Fors, Grand Central's community relations coordinator and habitat project leader. "There has been a sighting of a barn owl about two miles from the landfill. We have a barn owl box up on a 30-foot pole waiting for a pair to nest."

Adrienne said Grand Central plans to recertify its programs with the Wildlife Habitat Council this year.

Give the Gift of Life This Valentine's Day

February 14th is Valentine's Day, the day we celebrate love. It is also National Organ Donor Day, a day to celebrate the gift of life. Those who have received a gift from an organ donor celebrate this day every day.

Lisa Rigione and her family became involved with the "Gift of Life Organ Donor

Program" three years ago when Lisa's son, Mike DeBiase was an organ donor, giving the gift of life, on National Organ Donor Day, February 14, 2015. His organs were donated and saved the lives of six individuals. Saving their families from suffering the heartache and grief that Lisa and her family have dealt with since losing her 23 year old son unexpectedly three years ago. Mike passed away on February 12th, 2015. One week before his 24th birthday, from a brain bleed.

Since then Lisa has been an advocate for the "Gift of Life" Foundation.

Speaking at various events telling her story while hoping to bring awareness about organ donation and the gift of life to others. Lisa speaks to groups about organ donation. She has spoken to high school students in their driver's education classes, at churches, health fairs, and most recently to student nurses at Cedar Crest School of Nursing. Her message is always from the heart telling her personal story of losing her oldest son Michael, suddenly and finding out that he was an organ donor, (she had no idea) and making sure that her sons wishes were honored. Lisa says "organ donation saves lives, and you just never know when you, your loved ones, or friends may need an organ to live. There are many myths and misconceptions about organ

donation. There is no age limit for organ donors. You are never too old, or too sick to be a donor. The oldest known organ donor was in his 90's. Not even Cancer excludes you from being an organ donor.

Every organized religion believes in organ donation. It takes minutes to become a donor. You can even register up online. The best way to indicate your decision to become an organ donor is by adding the organ donor designation to your drivers license or state I.D. card and then tell your family of your decision. "Organ donation can save many lives and spare families the heartache of losing a loved one who may be waiting for a donor" says Lisa.

Here are a few facts about organ and tissue donation. On average, a single organ and tissue donor can save or enhance the lives of 50 plus people. More than 121,000 people are currently waiting for an organ transplant in the United States. Almost 2,000 of them are 18 years old or younger. Nearly 6,000 people await transplants in the Gift of Life Donor Program service region (eastern Pennsylvania, Southern New Jersey and Delaware)

More than 80 organ transplants take place in the United States every day.

More than 30,000 patients began new lives in 2017 thanks to organ transplants.

More than 47,000 patients had their sight restored last year through cornea transplants.

An average of 22 patients die every day because there are not enough organs donated.

Every 10 minutes a person is added to the nation's organ transplant waiting list.

One Donor Donation Can:

Donate kidneys to free two people from dialysis treatments needed to sustain life.

Save the lives of patients awaiting heart, liver, lung or pancreas transplants. Give sight to two people through the donation of corneas. Donate bone to repair injured joints or to help save a limb threatened by cancer. Help burn victims heal more quickly through donation of skin. Save eight lives. In 30 seconds.

You can also be a Living Organ Donor, you may be thinking what is a Living Organ Donor?

Most organ donations take place after the donor has died, some organs and tissues can be donated from living donors. Transplant waiting lists are continually increasing and the shortage of organs continues to grow for

available transplants. Patients in extreme need of a life saving procedure can be helped through living donation. Advantages of Living Donation: Transplants from family members that have a stronger genetic match between the living donor and transplant recipient decreases the risk of rejection.

Living donation allows the procedure to be scheduled at a time that works best for the donor and recipient.

Transplant patients who receive a living donor kidney usually see immediate function.

Types of Organs Donated by Living Donors:

Kidney, this is the most frequent type of living organ donation. Living individuals can donate one of their two well-

functioning kidneys. All living donors will experience a decrease in their kidney function, their remaining kidney provides the necessary function needed to remove waste from the body.

Liver, individuals can donate a segment of their liver, your liver has the ability to regenerate and regain full function.

Lung, although lung lobes do not regenerate, in rare cases individuals can donate a lobe of one lung.

Makes: 15 truffles, depending on size.


INGREDIENTS:

5 oz. Cream Cheese 1 1/2 tsp Raspberry extract (or 1-2 tablespoons seedless raspberry jam) 4 cups powdered sugar 10 oz. dark chocolate Red food dye



DIRECTIONS:

In a large bowl, mix together the cream cheese and raspberry extract (or jam). Once this is well mixed, slowly add the powdered sugar a little bit at a time while you continue to mix until you have added all of it. Then add in just enough red food coloring to get a pink tint to the mixture. Roll the mixture into balls and place on a baking sheet and place in the freezer or fridge for a few minutes to harden, about 30 minutes. While the balls chill, melt the chocolate. Take the balls out and dip into the chocolate one-by-one until all of the balls are dipped. For a decorative touch add red or pink sprinkles on top or dust with some powdered sugar.


