Alvin Powell played for both the Seattle Seahawks and the Miami Dolphins. Despite his professional success, his body and mind fell prey to the disease of addiction. By 1988, he was a full blown crack and cocaine addict, drinking and smoking pot as well. Knocking on death's door, this father of three turned his life around. He has dedicated his life to helping others break through the crisis.

Slate Belt Heritage Center

The Slate Belt Heritage Center (SBHC), located at 30 North 1st Street, Bangor, PA will be celebrating its 18th Anniversary of incorporation in conjunction with the **Spring Opening on Saturday, April 1st**. The Heritage Center is a not-for-profit 501(c) 3 organization whose mission is: To establish and offer for public view and educational purposes: artifacts, displays, DVD's, oral histories, genealogies and research information that reflect local Slate Belt history and heritage, and to perpetuate our Slate Belt Heritage, ethnic contributions, industry and history so that future generations may learn and appreciate our valued past.

The Heritage Center occupies the former 1907 Bangor Town Hall in the heart of the Slate Belt. Displays focus on the lives of people who settled this part of America, from the Lenape to the waves of immigrants-the Scotsirish, German, Cornish, Welsh, Italian, Jewish and others whose families live here today. The Heritage Center also houses rooms for the textile and slate industries, in addition to the Homefront and Fire rooms.

SBHC presents Preservation Awards to people who preserve Slate Belt heritage and hosts students and teachers ranging from local 4th graders to the University of Pennsylvania Preservation and Design classes. The Center preserves nearly 3000 Slate Belt treasures which inspire heritage murals, historic building rehabs, family research and trips down memory lane. Upgraded computer hardware and software increase public use of Heritage Center collections like the "Homefront Letters". Recently, safe, efficient and versatile lighting was installed in the Council Chamber. SBHC produces programs, exhibits, and tours for community groups, schools, special events, reunions and other museums. In 2016, the Center facilitated the historic architectural survey of the 1907 Italianate building.

The Slate Belt Heritage Center produces changing exhibits, monthly programs and seasonal events. Featured this year in the Council Chamber, will be "Letters to Homefront" A Love Story Between a Community and its' World War II Soldiers".

This display is to compliment the book that the Heritage Center has just published.

SBHC is open to the public Saturdays and Sunday 12pm-3pm April through October, and Sundays 12pm-3pm November through March. Admission is FREE. Private tours are available upon request. Monthly presentations are held the second Thursday of each month from April-November at 7:00pm and the second Sunday of each month from December-March at 2:00pm. Meet The Authors of Letters to Homefront

What began as a treasure trove find of over 4000 letters, postcards and v-mails has culminated in the publishing of the Slate Belt Heritage Center's latest book: Letters to Homefront Magazine: A Love Story Between a Community and Its WWII Soldiers. On Thursday, April 20, 2017 @ 7:00 PM, the Heritage Center will hold its monthly historic presentation entitled: "Meet the Authors". Slate Belt Resident - Professor Earl Hulihan Honored by Marquis Who's Who for Excellence in the Health Care Field

Medical and Dental Expenses May Impact Your Taxes

Medical expenses can trim taxes. Keeping good records and knowing what to deduct make all the difference. Here are some tips to help taxpayers know what qualifies as medical and dental expenses:

- Itemize. Taxpayers can only claim medical expenses that they paid for in 2016 if they itemize deductions on a federal tax return.
- Qualifying Expenses. Taxpayers can include most medical and dental costs that they paid for themselves, their spouses and their dependents including:
- The costs of diagnosing, treating, easing or preventing disease.
- The costs paid for prescription drugs and insulin.
- The costs paid for insurance premiums for policies that cover medical care.
- Some long-term care insurance costs.

Exceptions and special rules apply. Costs reimbursed by insurance or other sources normally do not qualify for a deduction. More examples of what costs taxpayers can and can't deduct are in IRS Publication 502, Medical and Dental Expenses.

- Travel Costs Count. It is possible to deduct travel costs paid for medical care. This includes costs such as public transportation, ambulance service, tolls and parking fees. For use of a car, deduct either the actual costs or the standard mileage rate for medical travel. The rate is 19 cents per mile for 2016
- No Double Benefit. Don't claim a tax deduction for medical expenses paid with funds from your Health Savings Accounts or Flexible Spending Arrangements. Amounts paid with funds from these plans are usually tax-free.
- Taxpayers should keep a copy of their tax return. Beginning in 2017, taxpayers using a software product for the first time may need their Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) amount from their prior-year tax return to verify their identity.

There isn't a day that goes by when we don't get a visitor or calls from individuals stating that they are investors looking for "flip properties". Some actually are investors and flippers. They actually have experience, available funds, and are ready to pounce on the next

opportunity that comes on the market. Most callers, in reality, are those who have watched one of the too many flip shows on TV and believe, for some reason, that they can do what the actors are doing.

Flipping can be profitable! Some individuals do it for a living (you will be competing with them). It is not as easy as it looks. I personally have "flipped homes" since the 1980's when it didn't even have a name. In recent years I have chosen to work in conjunction with several clients as their Realtor rather than competing with them.

If you are serious about flipping some important considerations must be considered.

1. You will need money! If you don't have your, you should get approved by a lender who will finance this type of investment. They are rare and will charge about 4% (points) of the loan as well as 10% to 18% interest. Make sure they will also lend the money need for improvements. Consider that a successful flip should take about 6 months. During that time you will be paying for taxes, interest, insurance, maintenance, and utilities as well as the supplies and contractors making the improvements.

MAKE SURE... that you have the funds available! When a flip property comes available it will sell immediately. The Seller will want proof of funds right now... not "don't worry, I can get it"

2. Look for properties in desirable locations and priced at a point where there is an opportunity to profit. For example, if the homes in the market around the property are selling for \$ 125,000 and you can buy a home for \$ 60,000 it sounds like a good deal. Consider you buying and selling costs, your rehab costs, carrying costs, and taxes on the profit. If all of these come to \$ 100,000, and you can make \$25,000 by selling around \$ 125,000 then consider it a reasonable opportunity. Keep in mind as nice as you make it, the market (and Appraisal) will hold the price around the market average.

3.Unknowns will come up. Obviously, the properties that are bought for flipping are in some type of distress. Even a thorough inspection cannot determine surprises. Bringing it up to code can be expensive. As in a recent case the oil burner needed substantial repair...it meant a \$ 1000 bill that wasn't planned. A bad septic or well could easily sink your project. You will run into lead pipes, knob and tube wiring, and numerous other unforeseen costs. Before you can begin you will have to clean it out...several dumpsters could cost \$3000 (including labor)

A HO SEA By Jackie Allergy season is jus

Allergy season is just around the corner and this year it is sure to sneak up on us sooner than later. There are allergies that are inherited and allergies that are acquired. Allergies can both stem from an inherited gene or be acquired from environmental influences. Acquired allergies develop because of weakened immune and digestive systems. Levels

of stress, lifestyle decisions, eating habits, and certain medication all contribute to weakening the immune system and tricking the body into believing it is allergic to a particular allergen when normally it would not be. Some professionals recommend taking immunotherapy shots to slowly introduce the foreign substances to the body so that over time the body can get used to it and better identifies this substance as a non-threat to the body. A more holistic approach is to strengthen the immune system rather than concentrate on the allergy. 80% of the immune system is in the gut. Work on strengthening the gut by eating plenty of fermented probiotic rich foods and drinks like kimchi, sauerkraut, Kombucha and kefir. A quality probiotic will also help repopulate the gut with beneficial bacteria and reduce the incidence of allergies. Eat healing foods like bone broth and limit processed food, carbs, and sugn. Increase your intake of raw organic fruits and vegetables. All this is especially important to do a few weeks before allergy season. When all else fails there are many natural forms of relief that you can try before reaching for the OTC antihistamine. ACV- Apple cider vinegar, in theory reduces mucous production and cleanses the lymphatic system. Take 1 teaspoon of raw "with the mother" ACV in water three times a day. Of course doing this will help with so much more than allergies. Digestion, lowering cholesterol, and blood sugar to name a few

Neti Pot-Some people find relief by filling a net pot with a saline rinse to flush out sinuses of allergies and irritations. Use a store bought rinse or make your own by dissolving 1 teaspoon of Himalayan or sea salt in a quart of boiled distilled water. Cool completely, put in the neti pot, put in nostril one nostril and watch it drain out the other. Your kids will find this fascinating.

Local Raw Honey- Help your body adapt to environmental allergies by consuming local raw honey. It is like a natural allergy shot. Take 1 teaspoon twice a day of raw local honey from as close as possible to where you live. Start 1 month before allergy season and during. Consuming raw honey has many benefits and luckily we live in an area where we can easily find it.

Bee polien- reduces histamine, which is the same target over-the-counter medications act upon. It can be effective for respiratory diseases, ranging from asthma to chronic sinus infections. Start by taking ½ tsp and increase to a tablespoon. Check for reactions that simulate allergies. You may have to slowly acquire a tolerance. Take with food. You can sprinkle on cereal, salads and mix into smoothies. Also important to find it locally sourced.

Essential oils- Diffusing oils such as peppermint, lavender, lemon, and tea tree can give a person suffering from allergies great relief. Diffuse when needed. Apply peppermint oil (dilute for those with sensitive skin) to the base of the neck twice a day. You can also make a sinus bomb by adding 2 drops of peppermint,

2 drops of fea tree, and 2 of lemon essential oils, cupping the mug with hands and inhaling the steam a couple times. Be sure to have tissues ready! Enjoy!

4. Now you are ready to begin. Established contractors and others who are able to do the work themselves have a tremendous advantage over those who must hire others. It also helps if you know where to find deals on the products that you will need. The most money made with a flip is made with 'Sweat Equity' ...that is the money earned, or saved by performing the work yourself. By the way... do not forget to get the proper permits, etc. from the municipality that the property is located in. In most areas, you will have to have a code inspection conducted prior to selling.

5. Be selective as to the improvements that you will make. A flip usually involves considerably more that painting and putting new carpeting in. Buyers have come to expect a renewed condition when they buy a flipped home. That does not mean it has to have granite counters, etc.

6. Now that you are ready to cash out, make sure you list your project with an experienced Realtor. Any hiccup will cost you time...and money. Several mortgage-related rules are in place that you should consider. For example, you cannot enter into an Agreement to sell this property with an FHA buyer until 90 days after the deed has been recorded. In some areas, if the transaction will close within 6 months of the date that your deed was recorded, two Appraisals will be required by the mortgage company (you usually will be paying for one of them).

You get them in the mail...Ads on TV..."COME TO OUR FREE WORKSHOP" ALL of these "programs" that are offered are designed to sell you services. I am aware of one group in Bethlehem who paid \$40,000 to join a group. I believe they were disappointed.

So, in closing, "Flipping Homes" can be a reasonably profitable business. But it really is not for everyone. It is a business! There are risks and rewards.


