30th Annual Farm Animal Frolic at Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm on May 19 & 20 and May 26 & 27

Quiet Valley's 30th annual Farm Animal Frolic is May 19 & 20 and May 26 & 27, Saturdays 10 am to 4 pm, Sundays noon to 4 pm. To folks in the 21st century springtime means warmer weather, flowers blooming and the return of robins. It's time to pack away snow shovels and think about getting the lawn furniture out. In the early 1800s it meant fresh greens became available, a real treat after a bland winter diet. The kitchen garden was planted with such things as peas, onions, beets and carrots. Chickens started laying eggs again and it was also when the animals on the homestead had their babies. At Farm Animal Frolic we celebrate the renewal of life that comes with the season of Spring.

Meet the baby farm animals up close and personal. See kid goats and lambs frolicking about. If you've ever wonder where the saying "two shakes of a lamb's tail" came from you can see the reason for yourself. Chicks will be peeping away and some will be hatching in incubators so visitors can watch them crack



out of their shells. There will be a new calf for the children to meet and quests of all ages will laugh at the ducklings as they play in the water.

Fish Tacos with Fresh Lime Sauce

Ingredients:

- 1 pound Tilapia fillets
- 2 tablespoons taco seasoning mix (from 1-oz package)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 box taco shells
- 1 container (6 oz.) Greek Fat Free plain yogurt
- 1/2 to 1 teaspoon grated lime peel
- 1 teaspoon lime juice
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 4 cups coleslaw mix shredded cabbage and carrots from 16 oz. bag
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 1 small jalapeno chile, seeded and chopped fine

Directions:

Sprinkle the taco seasoning mix evenly across both sides of fish fillets.

Heat oil in 12-inch skillet until hot. Cook fish for 6 to 8 minutes over medium heat, turning once, until fish flakes easily using a fork. Divide into bite-size pieces.

While the fish cooks, follow package directions to heat taco shells. Combine yogurt, lime peel, lime juice, sugar and salt. Stir in coleslaw

mix, cilantro and jalapeño in a large bowl. Let stand for 5 minutes. Add slightly less than 1/4 cup fish and 1/4 cup coleslaw mixture into each taco shell and then top each with about 1 tablespoon diced tomato. Serves 5

Puppy Quitos

Include your pooch in the Cinco de Mayo festivities with this yummy treat!

Ingredients:

- 2 large sweet potatoes, cooked
- 1 pound of ground turkey
- 1 bell pepper, diced
- 1 zucchini, julienn

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line your muffin pan with cupcake liners.
- 2. Peel the sweet potatoes. Discard the skins.
- 3. Grate the potatoes.
- 4. Press approx. 2 tablespoons of sweet potato into each cupcake liner. Mold the potato into the shape of the liner,
- 5. Bake the sweet potato in the oven 15-20 minutes.
- 6. While the sweet potato is baking, place the ground turkey it in a nonstick skillet on the stove on medium. Using a spatula, break up the meat into small, bite size pieces as it cooks. Continue turning and stirring the meat until completely cooked.
- 7. Once meat is browned carefully drain the grease from the meat.
- 8. Remove the potato shells from the oven. Spoon 1 tablespoon of the ground turkey into each cup. Garnish with zucchini and bell pepper.

When wrapped placed the puppy-quitos in the refrigerator. They will keep for up to three days.


