Karen Bodine, club member pictured with Marc was one of the volunteer readers. Marc described the magazine was the forerunner of Facebook and Twitter. The book was divided into chapters. One chapter was "Fairest of the Month"; three club members Virginia DePue, Doris Deen, and Janet Jones were among the young ladies featured. Marc related the amazing story of how the magazine started in 1942 with 13 pages and was published monthly for 42 months until 1946 when it had grown to 60 pages. Every issue had a different front and back cover. Local churches helped in this project by tracking the whereabouts of their members and handling the mailing. It was published in Easton by a publisher who did not accept monetary payment, claiming the morale of these soldiers was more important than money. When Horace was drafted and went to war, Mona continued to publish the magazine on her own. She went to testify before Congress in Washington DC to request a special exception from the paper rationing that was in effect and got unlimited quantities of paper. The Slate Belt Heritage center was very fortunate to obtain copies of all the magazines and have them in a special display at the center.

Know these Facts Before Deducting a Charitable Donation

If taxpayers gave money or goods to a charity in 2016, they may be able to claim a deduction on their federal tax return. Taxpayers can use the Interactive Tax Assistant tool. Can I Deduct my Charitable Contributions?. to help determine if their charitable contributions are deductible. Here are some important facts about charitable donations:

- 1. Qualified Charities. Taxpayers must donate to a qualified charity. Gifts to individuals, political organizations or candidates are not deductible. To check the status of a charity, use the IRS Select Check tool.
- 2. Itemize Deductions. To deduct charitable contributions, taxpavers must file Form 1040 and itemize deductions. File Schedule A. Itemized Deductions, with a federal tax return.
- 3. Benefit in Return. If taxpayers get something in return for their donation, they may have to reduce their deduction, Taxpavers can only deduct the amount that exceeds the fair market value of the benefit received. Examples of benefits include merchandise, meals, tickets to events or other goods and services.
- 4. Type of Donation. If taxpayers give property instead of cash, their deduction amount is normally limited to the item's fair market value. Fair market value is generally the price they would get if the property sold on the open market. If they donate used clothing and household items. those items generally must be in good condition or better. Special rules apply to cars, boats and other types of property donations.
- 5. Noncash Charitable Contributions, File Form 8283, Noncash Charitable Contributions, for all noncash gifts totaling more than \$500 for the year. Complete section-A for noncash property contributions worth \$5,000 or less. Complete section-B for noncash property contributions more than \$5,000 and include a qualified appraisal to the return. The type of records they must keep depends on the amount and type of their donation.
- 6. Donations of \$250 or More. If taxpayers donated cash or goods of \$250 or more, they must have a written statement from the charity. It must show the amount of the donation and a description of any property given. It must also say whether they received any goods or services in exchange for the gift.





SYNAGRO SUBMITS BUILDING PERMIT FOR SLATE BELT **HEAT RECOVERY PROJECT**

Synagro, today, requested a building permit to develop its Slate Belt Heat Recovery Center tying directly into the Green Knight Energy Center and within the township's solid waste zone.

The facility, which would dry biosolids to create a Class A pellet that can be used as a fertilizer or a fuel, is a permitted use in the township's solid waste zone. This site adjoins the land on which the Green Knight Energy Center operates. The waste heat from the Green Knight facility will be the energy used to dry the biosolids.

In November, Synagro proposed building the center a short distance away in a commercial-industrial zone where the facility would be considered a nonconforming use. This proposal remains before the Plainfield Twp. Zoning Hearing Board.

"The new application fully complies with the Plainfield Township Zoning Officer's determination letter dated December 15, 2016. We have spent the last three months undertaking a comprehensive redesign to locate the facility in the Township's solid waste zone, and in full conformity with the original waste heat recovery design of the Energy Center," said Jim Hecht, Synagro's Project Developer.

Synagro expects to spend up to \$26 million constructing the facility. Construction will create an estimated 40 temporary construction jobs and operation of the facility will create 16 permanent, family-sustaining jobs. Here are other project

The Slate Belt Heat Recovery Project will meet or exceed all applicable regulations, including those enforced by the EPA, PADEP, Delaware River Basin Commission, and the National Fire Safety Bureau.

Synagro has nine drying facilities currently operating in the US, some with residents much closer than at this site. None of those facilities have received odor complaints. The control of potential odors is inherent in the design and operations. The building and process air will be captured and treated by engineered airscrubbers designed and proven to eliminate odors before indoor air is exhausted

Water generated by the facility's drying process will be collected and treated by an on-site wastewater treatment system to meet or exceed all applicable environmental regulations for discharge.

The facility will be equipped with all fire prevention and suppression systems required by local and state building codes.

Synagro expects the plant to receive 20 in-bound trucks each day and its manufactured fuel or fertilizer product will be shipped in five trucks per day. All in-bound and out-bound trucks will be covered and subject to all state and federal transportation laws.

Mr. Hecht said the company operates a plant in Philadelphia that services the city and a number of other nearby municipalities. Recently Synagro hosted an in-depth tour opportunity for members of the community to visit the Philadelphia Bio-Fuels Drver.

"We have a demonstrated track record of being a good neighbor with compliant operations at the dryer facilities we operate and we look forward to being a reliable partner for the Slate Belt community," Mr. Hecht said.



Gingersnap Crust: 9 inch pie pan

1 pack of graham crackers 2 tsp ground cinnamon 1/4 tsp ground cloves

1/4 cup brown sugar 2 tsp ground ginger 1/8 tsp ground black pepper

5 tbsp melted butter

Combine these ingredients as listed in a food processor and press into the pie pan and toss in the refrigerator!

Lemon filling:

3 egg yolks 1/2 cup fresh lemon juice 1 can sweetened condensed milk

1 lemon zested

1 tsp grated fresh ginger or 1/2 tsp ground ginger

1 tsp vanilla extract

Whip egg yolks until light and fluffy, about 2 mins then slowly add the sweetened condensed milk until well combined. Add the remaining ingredients until incorporated. Slate Belt Animal Control and Slate Belt Animal Advocacy Group Hold Press Conference

On Thursday March 31st, the Slate Belt Council of Governments held a meeting to discuss the challenges that our Animal Control Officer (ACO) has faced since June of last year. The ACO, hired by the Council, was brought on to help alleviate the stress

faced by our local and state police departments when it comes to loose, stray and abandoned domestic animals in the Slate Belt area. This area includes Bangor Borough, Pen Argyl Borough, Plainfield Township, Portland Borough, Washington Township, Roseto and Wind Gap Borough despite only having one person, currently ACO Christine Mammi. The previous officer, Sue Henn, laid the groundwork and structure out prior to her passing this past year.

The primary focus of this meeting was to explain the current mission statement as well as challenges that are currently being faced. The new program focuses on rehabilitating, spaying/neutering and rehoming the stray and abandoned animals rather than just hold for 2 days and either return to the owners or, in some cases, be put down. Certain breeds of dogs, mainly pit bulls, are seldom taken by animal shelters due to their reputation as aggressive but with this new system, all breeds of dogs, as well as cats, will be given proper medical attention and a chance at a new life.

Currently, Christine Mammi covers the Slate Belt area and on an average day, may receive calls as early as 5:30 am and as late as 1:00 am. From stray dogs, abandoned animals in apartments, feral cats and even the occasional pet that escapes from the owners yard or home, she diligently works to safely capture and evaluate the condition of the animal. Through the Facebook groups, the Slate Belt Animal Advocacy Group and Slate Belt Watch, her ultimate goal is to reunite lost pets with their owners. For the pets that are now abandoned or feral, they are looking to eventually build a housing area in the Slate Belt so people can come in and adopt those who were either given up or taken away due to various circumstances.

The majority of the animals are returned home to their proper owners, but in other cases, they have been abandoned or neglected by their owners and now fall on both the Slate Belt Animal Advocacy group and the Animal Control Board, both which are under the Council of Governments. Some of the local animal hospitals and local foster homes have helped give many of these pets a second chance at a forever home. Feral cats, which may not be suitable for homes, can be captured and spayed or neutered, re-released without having to worry about the stray animal population getting out of control. The Animal Control Board rents out non-kill traps and can help give vouchers to help local citizens keep the stray population from becoming a serious issue.

CAN AUTISM BE MEDICAL? By Jackie Talero-Rueda, The Crunchy Mom

When my child was officially diagnosed with autism at age 2 1/2 we asked the developmental pediatrician what we could do to help our son. She asked if he was in speech therapy, occupational therapy, and behavioral services. We told her he was in all three already. She then said "you are doing everything you can possibly do for him, just continue what you are doing." My son was humming at the table next to us while he squeezed his belly against it. I looked at her and said "he always does that when he

poops" To which she responded "That's normal for kids with Autism, I see it all the time, the humming is a stim." (For those who don't know, a stim is a repetitive behavior that kids with Autism have, like hand flapping, spinning, and vocalizations.)

The doctor then sent us on our way. Years later, we found out that the humming and pushing his tummy on the table were in fact because of constipation and extreme gut dysbiosis. Yeast, bacterial overgrowth, leaky gut, and food allergies were all causing him discomfort. The wheat and milk proteins he was consuming were producing an opioid effect in his developing brain. He was unreachable in his own world and at times crying, tantrums, unconsolable. When we removed gluten and casein (wheat and milk proteins) he started saying words and pointing to items we asked him to identify. His doctor added nutritional supplements like cod liver oil, vitamin A. D. E. minerals. B vitamins and an organic diet free of wheat, dairy, artificial food colorings, preservatives, and GMOs. He treated yeast and bacterial overgrowth. He added mitochondrial support as well. My son's eye contact improved, his stimming lessened and his turmmy flattened. His traditional therapies were worthwhile now. They were finally helping. My son still has autism and to me, autism will never define who he is but as his body heals most of the autism symptoms that were impacting him and our family greatly are now gone, and some less severe. So yes, to me, and to many other parents doctors, and people out there, autism is medical and treatable. I'm here to tell you that this isn't quackery, Many of these children's symptoms are blamed on autism and are overlooked. Children with autism almost always have medical conditions that cause or aggravate the symptoms of autism. Treating underlying conditions helps the child's health improve. When a child is in less pain he can learn better, have less aggression, communicate, and learn coping skills among many other improvements. I hope this article may plant a seed in anyone that may need it. I mean no insult to anyone that loves a child with autism as he or she is. I just want to spread awareness on the great possibility of a child having underlying medical issues. Many of our kids cannot express pain, or discomfort making it very hard for them to live to their fullest potential. We work with a MAPS physician and I suggest that anyone that may want to pursue this type of intervention to do so as well. MAPS (Medical Academy of Pediatric Special Needs) doctors are real board certified physicians trained to treat the underlying causes of the medical conditions, rather than the symptoms. Never attempt any medical treatment natural or not without medical supervision. In
