





GRIEF RECOVERY SPECIALIST JENNIFER KASANDER BRINGS RENOWNED PROGRAM TO LEHIGH VALLEY

"You are not broken," is the core truth shared by Jennifer Kasander, Certified Grief Recovery Specialist and Life Coach.

It's a message that she emphatically brings to the table whenever working with clients in person in the Slate Belt and surrounding areas of the Lehigh Valley or through video sessions online.

Grief is the most powerful and misunderstood of emotions. It can

come from the death of a partner or family member as well as manifest itself after a significant life loss like a divorce or career setback. It's natural for people to want to quickly get past the emotional pain that stems from the loss of a loved one or relationship.

The grieving process isn't easy, but it is normal, natural and necessary. But like many things, when it comes to our emotional well-being, fast is not always tantamount to good. And ignoring the problem won't make it go away. In fact, it can make it worse.

There are so many myths that keep us in pain. Grief is cumulative, especially when we don't deal with it when it happens.

A Recovery Method That Works - Kasander is a graduate of the Grief Recovery InstituteTM, whose renowned Grief Recovery Method has been featured on CNN and MSNBC as well as the pages of Time, USA Today and The Wall Street Journal. The program, which has helped thousands across the country deal with loss, works to dispel many of the myths surrounding grief, including advice to "just keep busy," and the potentially damaging adage "time heals all wounds." Understanding and overcoming grief is a process that benefits from working with a trained grief coach like Jennifer, a woman who has walked the proverbial mile in her clients' shoes. For her, the road to helping others work through grief began with a significant loss of her own.

A native of Eastern Pennsylvania, Kasander grew up in a close-knit traditional Italian family. Life dealt Kasander a 'one- two' blow. Without Jeff, she was faced with the sad reality of having to sell the practice that they built together. "That was brutal," Kasander recalls. "It wasn't just selling a business. It was part of my life."

Time Alone Isn't Magic - For Kasander, the adage "time heals all wounds," proved a fallacy. Two years into her grieving process, Jennifer (a very upbeat person) was still feeling lost in her own skin. 2016 proved to be a real game changer. It was then that she began grief recovery work. It was through the Grief Recovery Method that she realized the grief she was experiencing from her husband's death also involved unresolved grief from the untimely death of her sister years earlier.

After going through the program herself, a renewed

Jennifer decided that she could use those skills to help others like her. And, in 2017, she received her certification as a specialist from the Grief Recovery Institute. With clients, Kasander "unstuffs" feelings that have been left to fester as she helps them deliver emotional communication with those they've lost. Through helping others, Kasander feels she's also helped

I hrough helping others, Kasander feels she's also helped herself. She proudly says "it's a lightness to come home to my home," adding "I feel alive and engaged."

Slate Belt Heritage Center Monthly Historic Presentation



The Slate Belt Heritage Center will hold their monthly historic presentation on **Sunday**, **January 19th at 2:00pm**. Speaker for the afternoon will be Mr. John Reinhart, President of St. David's Welsh Society

and former Superintendent of the Bangor and Easton Area School Districts. Mr. Reinhart will conduct a program on "Slate Folk Art of the Area". A founding member of the Heritage Center, and an educator for over forty-eight years, he and his wife Judy have been collecting decorated slate for over fifty years. Both are lifelong residents of the Slate Belt and both have had family members who were engaged in the slate industry. An important part of their collection of artifacts includes items that were created and given away as gifts and tokes of affection. The Slaters used the skills they acquired while working in the local slate quarries. These items were made by people without formal art training and instruction. Some items reflect ethnic and cultural interests. While much of the slate produced by local guarries was for architectural purposed, the guarries also provided this by-product which was used to produce decorated mantels, game boards, bookends, and household articles, including lamps. Mr. Reinhart's book, From the Slate: O'r Lechen, The Welsh and the Folk Art of Pennsylvania's Slate Belt, published through the Heritage Center and funded by Merchant's Bank provided readers with the first documentation of examples of the slate folk art created in the region. The Heritage Center has its own extensive collection of slate folk art. The presentation will include both artifacts and photos of the beautiful items the Reinhart's have collected. Bangor VFW President: Membership Not Exclusive to Vets - Bangor VFW Post 739 To Host Membership Drive on January 18 Submitted by Keith Kutz Jr.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 739 in Bangor is comprised of three separate but symbiotic organizations. The Post consists of veterans that have served overseas in time of conflict. The Post commander is Nick Alfero Jr., a Marine Veteran and the youngest commander in the Post's 85 year history.

The Auxiliary consists of the spouses of post members or relatives of veterans that are eligible to be post members. Auxiliary President is Deborah Riley a US Army veteran.

The Home Association comprises of veterans not eligible for Post Membership or any other non-veteran individual who would like to join supporting our Military, Veterans and community. The President of the Home Association is Keith Kutz Jr., a lifelong Bangor resident. The organization sends care packages to our service men and service women. As well as helping those less fortunate, food banks, and our veterans organizations. Each year they donate in excess of \$20,000. The facility hosts the local Civil Air Patrol Squadron, Boy Scout Troop 38, Blue Eagle Marching Band and sponsors the Lehigh Valley division of the US Naval Sea Cadet Corp.

The VFW holds many annual events for its members including a Member's Appreciation Day, Veterans Day, POW/MIA and Memorial Day events. An annual chili cook off, a pig roast and Halloween events are held. Children's movie nights are held a couple of times a year as well as an annual visit from Santa and the Easter Bunny. 

Don't Forget to License Your Dog for 2020 Rep. Joe Emrick

Happy New Year! With the Arrival of the New Year The

Department of Agriculture is reminding all dog owners to be sure they get a license for 2020. All dogs three months of age and older are required to be licensed. The fee for an annual dog license is \$6.50, or \$8.50 if the animal is not spayed or neutered. Lifetime licenses are available for dogs that have permanent identification such as a microchip or tattoo. Discounts are available for gualifying older adults and persons with disabilities. Licensing dollars support the work of the Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, which inspects Pennsylvania's kennels and ensures the health and well-being of the dogs that spend their lives there; investigates and prosecutes illegal kennels and bad actors; protects the public by monitoring PA's dangerous dogs and investigating dog bites; and reunites licensed lost dogs with their families and helps unlicensed lost dogs find shelter. Pennsylvania dog licenses are available for purchase through Pennsylvania's county treasurers. To ensure you're purchasing a legitimate license and not being scammed, skip the search engine and type licenseyourdogpa.pa.gov into your browser's address bar find your county treasurer's information.
