

The # 1 Rookie mistake in selling is overpricing vour home. All Sellers want top dollar for their

house. Just because your neighbor's house sold for \$250,000, however, doesn't mean that yours should. Price is typically the reason why a house doesn't sell. Try not to act with emotions. Question your Real Estate Agent's rationale but consider his price recommendation seriously. (Be cautious, however, in a Seller's Market where listings are hard to come by, it is not unheard of for an agent to "buy your listing"... that is.. to falsely inflate the true value so you will list with him as opposed to another who has suggested a more accurate sale price)

The next mistake, don't be inflexible on price or terms. Again, keep emotions out of the decisions. Every buyer will want to negotiate a little. Find a price that you can be comfortable with and still enable the Buyer to feel that you have acted fairly. It is very common for a Buyer to ask for your help with his closing costs. Don't be offended. Have your Agent help negotiate a reasonable solution.

Third ..make sure your listing has good pictures. You can write a beautiful description, but Buyers focus on pictures. If they don't like what they see they won't get to the description.

You have heard this one before. Remove anything that may distract a buyer. This could be political items, personal items, etc.

In conjunction with the previous suggestion, CLEAN, CLEAN, CLEAN, Inside and out! Your home should be spotless. This includes windows, curtains, and outside landscaping. Remove seldom used items and clean out the attic. garage, etc. This will also help with the pictures noted above.

Make your house easy to be shown. Sometimes short notice appointments are necessary. It is best to leave during a showing to give the Buyers space. Some Buyers might not feel comfortable asking the agent questions or opening closet doors if they think the seller is looking over their shoulder. If you do go outside or leave during showings consider taking your pet with you. Even if a Buyer likes pets they will be a distraction at best. If you decide to stay inside do not follow the Buyers around the house. After the Buyers have viewed the entire home you might want to ask if there are any questions that you could answer.

New Quiet Valley High School Program Made Possible by DEP Grant

Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm hosted 58 10th grade biology students from Stroudsburg Area School District on Thurday, June 1st as a part of a very, unique program entitled "Planting Corn Harvest Knowledge". The students will be furthering what they have learned throughout the year on Genetics, and looking more closely at hybridization, agricultural history, and technology as well as exploring future careers in the Agricultural Sciences. This exciting hands-on learning experience is being funded through an Environmental Education grant from the Department of Environmental Protection.

Through the work of the grant, Quiet Valley is developing a regular curriculum offering which allows students to meet the objectives of the STEM curriculum. STEM approaches Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics through learning activities. This program offering utilizes the central theme of corn and its agricultural history to its present day farming to explore those areas. Actual hands-on learning will take place as students go out to the garden and test the soil, plant corn, and try out different instruments used for planting.

Stroudsburg Area School District Biology Teachers Mr. James DeRenzis and Mrs. Mindy Tkach have been integral in dovetailing the program with the students' classroom. Prof. Pamela Tabery, retired from the Biology Department at Northampton Community College and Volunteer at Quiet Valley, along with Quiet Valley Founder, Gary Oiler, and Director, Kat Muller have been part of the team working to provide an immersive experience to extend classroom learning in ways the students will find meaningful and memorable. "The really exciting part of this program," said Grant Coordinator, Sarah Raley "is where the classroom learning gets applied. Our hope is that some of the students will be excited by what they experience and consider pursuing professional careers in the agricultural sciences, technology, or research and development. There are so many prosperous entrepreneurial farm related businesses and if students like that potential they may be more inclined to apply themselves in their academic careers. They can get a long-term vision of how their learning could continue and ultimately serve them through opportunities in a wide variety of career paths. We hope that all the students will become inspired and motivated to harvest knowledge and become life-long science learners and gardeners as they cultivate the fruits of their learning."

Easy Strawberry Shortcake

Ingredients: Strawberries

1/1/2 lbs strawberries quartered and stemmed

3 tablespoons sugar

Cake:

2 cups all-purpose flour 2 teaspoons baking powder 1/4 teaspoon baking soda 2 tablespoons sugar 3/4 teaspoon salt 11/2 cups heavy whipping cream

Whipped Cream:

11/2 cups heavy cream chilled 3 Tablespoons sugar 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract 1 teaspoon freshly grated lemon zest

Directions:

Mix strawberries with 3 tablespoons sugar and refrigerate at least 30 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.

Sift together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, remaining 2 tablespoons sugar, and salt in a medium bowl. Add heavy cream and mix until just combined. Place mixture in an ungreased 8-inch square pan and bake until golden, approximately 18 to 20 minutes.

Remove shortcake from pan and place on a rack to cool slightly. Cut into 6 pieces and split each piece in half horizontally.

Mix all whipped cream ingredients in bowl with beaters about 1 1/2 to 2 minutes.

Spoon some of the strawberries with their juice onto each shortcake bottom. Top with a generous dollop of whipped cream and then the shortcake top. Spoon more strawberries over the top and serve. Serves 6

Always seek medical attention if you are allergic to bees, wasps, spiders or other insects. Immediately after getting stung, carefully remove any stinger left in the skin by gently scraping it out with a sanitized blade, fingernail, or credit card. Cleanse the area and make a paste by adding a little cool water to 1 teaspoon baking soda and 1 drop of lavender oil and place on the sting. The baking soda counteracts the acidity of the sting. You may also apply crushed aspirin or crushed papaya enzyme on the sting. Another quick way to find relief from any bug bite or sting is by mixing 5 drops lavender oil with 1 teaspoon vinegar and apply to the bite with a cotton ball. If you don't have lavender oil you can apply vinegar by itself. You may also apply lavender by itself or diluted in a carrier oil to relieve any insect bite or rash for that matter. Don't forget to always test skin sensitivity before applying anything on the skin. Aloe vera gel is very effective in relieving burning and itching from sunburn or poison ivy. Using the gel from a real plant is best. Just cut the skin off the leaf and apply the gel where relief is needed. Use as often as needed and store in the refrigerator. Using witch hazel is another great way to help stop itching from poison ivy and aids in healing. To help disinfect and heal the skin after getting poison ivy you can apply 1 drop of tea tree oil diluted with a carrier oil. As you can see there are many natural ways to help find relief from bites, rashes, and

sunburn. Always use therapeutic grade essential oils and always dilute with a carrier oil like coconut or olive oil. Though natural, essential oils are powerful and little is needed to do its job.

AARP Driver Safety Program

Formerly, "55-Alive", the new SMART DRIVER 4 and 8 hour classroom refresher / defensive driving course is designed for qualified drivers 50 and older. There are no tests and membership in the AARP is not necessary. All automobile insurance companies doing business in Pennsylvania are required by state law to give a minimum discount of 5% to all qualified policy holders age 55 and over who take the course. Be sure to first check with your insurance agent or company to make sure you qualify to receive a discount.

All classes are taught by trained, unpaid volunteer instructors. The 8 hour class is given in a two day period in two four-hour sessions, and is required for first timers. The one day 4-hour class is only open to those who provide evidence of taking a class during the last 36 months. A \$20 fee (\$15 for AARP members) is charged for either class. Class size is limited, so advance reservations are advised to assure placement in class. Those completing the course will be issued a certificate which is valid for three years. 

Quiet Valley's Children's Day Saturday, June 24th and Civil War Encampment - Saturday, June 24th - 25th

Quiet Valley's Children's Day will be held on Saturday, June 24, 2017.
