

Slate Belt Church's pastor, Steve Rebert, Jr. and his wife Sarah, cordially invite the community to attend their Easter drama presentation. The "Easter Walk-Thru" will



be represented after a five year hiatus. The performance is on Good Friday, April 2nd, from 6:00pm to 9:00pm.

This drama was written by church member Mary Eberhardt over twenty years ago. The most recent presentations were in 2013, 2014 and 2016.

Thirty plus cast members, in period costumes, will act out the events of Jesus birth, death and resurrection. The play is structured in 9 scenes set up in the Sunday School rooms in the Fellowship Hall. Tour Guides will walk the audience to the scenes during the 12 tour periods starting at 6:00 PM.

Mark Your Calendar and Make Your Voice Heard on Emergency Declarations.

When voters head to the polls for the May 18 primary election, they will have a say in the duration of future disaster emergency declarations in the Commonwealth.



Under legislation approved by the House and Senate, two proposed constitutional amendments regarding emergency declarations will appear on the ballot. One seeks to limit emergency declarations by a governor to a maximum of 21 days, unless extended by a vote of the Legislature, and the other would clarify that a concurrent resolution terminating or extending a disaster emergency declaration need not be presented to a governor for signature.

I voted "yes" to placing these questions on the ballot because I believe that your voice should be represented at all times, including during states of emergency, and that our system of checks and balances must be preserved. Executive powers to declare emergencies are sometimes needed to free up resources for an immediate response to situations such as natural disasters. I do not believe they should be used to circumvent the state Constitution, the separation of powers or – most importantly – the will of the people for extended periods of time.



The Salvation Army to Adopt New Model In Providing Social Services to Pen Argyl

The Salvation Army of Pen Argyl will soon be undergoing a transition. Effective June 30, 2021, the operations currently conducted out of the existing Corps Community Center will move under the supervision of the Easton

Corps.

Social services such as food, clothing and emergency assistance programs will continue without interruption, albeit under a different service model. Seasonal and holiday assistance will continue to be available, as will opportunities for children and senior citizens to attend camp.

"Change is never easy. It brings with it an uncertainty that can be very unsettling. The decision to change the way we provide service in Pen Argyl was necessary due to a need to reduce operational costs," said Lt. Col. Larry Ashcraft, Divisional Commander, The Salvation Army Pennsylvania and Delaware Division. "The financial ramifications of keeping things status quo were not going to work in the long term. By shifting oversight for operations to the Easton Corps, we are able to continue serving the greater Pen Argyl community as we've done for 130 years."

Over the last year, the Pen Argyl location provided food and critical support to some 598 families and brightened an uncertain Christmas Season by providing more than 1160

toys to children in need.

The Salvation Army in Pen Argyl has done its utmost to meet the extraordinary needs brought about because of the pandemic. Locally the Army raised \$4,052 in its annual 2020 Red Kettle Campaign. That money will stay in the Pen Argyl community and continue to benefit area residents in need who are served by The Salvation Army.

The spiritual needs of individuals will continue to be met. Sunday services will be available to congregants at The Salvation Army's Easton location, 1110 Northampton St, or the East Stroudsburg location at 226 Washington Street. The faithful are also invited to continue sharing the gospel via Facebook pages or SAConnects from the safety of their homes.

The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission has announced a single Statewide Mentored Youth Trout Day will occur on Saturday, March 27th and a single Statewide Opening Day of trout season will take place on Saturday, April 3rd.

As a result of this consolidation, separate regional mentored youth and opening days will not occur. Anglers are also reminded that because the mentored youth days were canceled in 2020, all Voluntary Youth Fishing Licenses purchased last season remain valid and will be honored during the 2021 season.

Slate Belt Rising Launches 2021 **Scholarship Program**

Program provides students the opportunity to further their education and help defray the cost of post-secondary education

Slate Belt Rising, a program of the Community Action Committee of the Lehigh Valley, announced it is now accepting applications for

its 2021 Scholarship Program. The \$500 scholarships are available to high school seniors who have been accepted at a four-year university/college, community college, technical school, or entering the workforce in a trade; as well as adults continuing their education. Applicants must reside in the Bangor Area School District or Pen Arayl School District.

"Slate Belt Rising created this scholarship program keeping in mind that there are people of all ages pursuing different levels of education and different career paths that need financial help to achieve their goals," said Stephen Reider, Director of Slate Belt Rising. "Our program allows students the versatility to use funds to continue their education at two- and four-year colleges and universities, as well as trade schools, graduate school, and purchase the tools needed to enter the workforce in a trade."

Applicants are required to submit an application, two letters of recommendation, and official school transcripts. Scholarship funds must be used exclusively for tuition at post-secondary educational institutions that normally maintain a regular faculty and curriculum, and for fees, books, supplies, and equipment required for courses at such institutions, for room and board expenses payable to the institution, or for the purchase of tools for a student entering the workforce in a trade.

Launched in 2019, the Slate Belt Rising Scholarship Program has provided \$6,000 in funds for nine students to date.


