



PA Professor of the Year Presents One-Man Show to Benefit Puerto Rico: Dr. Javier Ávila Brings His Celebrated Show to Zoellner Arts Center Dr. Javier Ávila, author, poet, and professor of English at Northampton Community College, will present his acclaimed one man show, The Trouble with My Name, on Thursday, November 2, at 7:30 p.m. in Baker Hall, Zoellner Arts Center. #### Cub Scout Pack 102 STEM program

Cub Scout Pack 102 is launching their STEM program on **Saturday October 21st,** STEM focuses on the development of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. On October 12, at Forks of the Delaware District-Minsi Trail Council Roundtable meeting, Cub Master, Tony Zedar gave a presentation about the STEM program. Mr. Zedar encouraged other Packs to start similar programs. Mr. Zedar spoke about the importance of engaging the youth in STEM activities at a young age, to better prepare them for careers ranging from construction to computer programming.

The newly re-chartered Pack 102 believes that part of the value of the Scouting Program(s) lies in preparing children to become active, productive members of their community. "Scouting has always used fun activities to teach practical skills," said Jana Morris Sarnowski, the Committee Chair. #### **ANTIOXIDANTS AND FREE** RADICALS By Jackie Talero-Rueda, **The Crunchy Mom**

Antioxidants are natural compounds that help protect the body from harmful free radicals. Free

radicals are normally present in the body in small numbers. Biochemical processes naturally lead to the formation of free radicals. They are your natural biological response to environmental toxins like cigarette smoke, automobile exhaust, sunlight, chemicals, cosmic and manmade radiation, and are even a key feature of pharmaceutical drugs (mercola). Your body also produces free radicals when you exercise and when you have inflammation anywhere in your body. So not all free radicals are bad. We need them to produce energy and free radicals produced by the immune system destroy viruses and bacteria. In a healthy individual the body keeps free radicals in check but when there is an excess in free radicals, damage to cells and tissue can occur. This can put you at risk of diseases and rapid aging. Free radical damage is thought by scientist to be the basis for the aging process. Substances known as antioxidants neutralize free radicals by binding to their electrons. Antioxidants are natural compounds that help protect the body from free radicals. Antioxidants are mother nature's way of providing your cells with adequate defense against attack. If you don't have an adequate supply of antioxidants to help squelch free radicals, then you can be at risk of oxidative stress, which leads to accelerated tissue and organ damage (mercola). Many antioxidants can be obtained from food sources like fresh fruits and vegetables but it is difficult to get enough of them from food only because of the amount of free radicals that are constantly being generated in our polluted environment. You can take antioxidants in supplemental form to help. It is better to take smaller doses of several antioxidants than a large amount of only one. There are a number of antioxidants that can only be obtained by food or supplements, like vitamin A, vitamin C, vitamin E, beta-carotene, other carotenoids, flavonoids, and the minerals selenium and zinc. The hormone melatonin is also a highly effective antioxidant and a powerful free radical neutralizer. Melatonin is produced by the body but also available in supplemental form. Certain herbs can have antioxidant properties as well such as bilberry, silymarin, and ginkgo biloba. Other crucial antioxidants that are produced by the body are glutathione, Alpha-Lipoid Acid (ALA) and CoQ10. In the coming weeks I will cover some of these antioxidants, where to obtain them. and how important they are.


