

# NCC to Hold Medical Tech and Respiratory Care Programs Info Session

Overall employment of medical laboratory technologists and technicians is projected to grow 13 percent from 2016 to 2026.

Northampton Community College well hold a free information session about its cooperative programs with Reading Community College, Medical Lab Technician and Respiratory Care on Monday, **November 26th, at 6:00pm** at the Student Enrollment Center, Bethlehem Campus, 3835 Green Pond Road, Bethlehem Township.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Statistics, the overall employment of medical laboratory technicians and of respiratory therapists is projected to grow faster than the national average from 2016 to 2026.

Medical Laboratory Technicians perform tests under the direction of a physician who specializes in diagnosing the causes and nature of disease. Medical Laboratory Technicians also work under the supervision of scientists doing research on new drugs or the improvement of laboratory techniques. Graduates may seek employment with hospitals, independent laboratories, physicians, clinics, public health agencies, pharmaceutical firms, research institutions and industrial laboratories. The program is accredited by the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Science (NAACLS).

The respiratory care program allows students to complete general education requirements at Northampton Community College. Upon completion on general education requirements, students would apply to the Reading Area Community College Respiratory Care Program. This program is fully accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care. Graduates are therefore eligible to take a national certifying exam to become a certified or registered Respiratory Therapist. 




# **Pen Argyl Salvation Army Food Pantry**

Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm will present its 28th annual Old Time Christmas event on December 1, 2 and December 8, 9 with candlelit toursleaving every 15 minutes beginning at 3:00 p.m., with the last group going out at 7:00 p.m.

More than any other holiday, Christmas celebrations center on the traditions of our families and our heritage. Begin a new tradition with your family this year during an outing to Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm, where the Christmas customs of the past are brought to life. From the softly glowing



lantern light to complimentary hot chocolate and cookies, Old Time Christmas is sure to become a favorite holiday pastime for many years to come.

Gather around a bonfire while you wait for your visit to the 1800s to begin. Guides in period clothing will lead guests on their journey into the past beginning with this year's Victorian skit. Experience a glimpse of an 1890s Christmas as the family makes holiday crafts and decorates the tree. Before you leave take a peek at their Christmas Putz, a homemade nativity and village scene that was a custom the Moravians began and was soon enthusiastically adopted by the Pennsylvania Germans.

Then off to a simple log cabin where we discover the root of many special Christmas customs still practiced today. At the one room schoolhouse it is a jolly time as the school marm leads both the musicians and guests in singing their favorite seasonal carols. There is plenty of nervous excitement in the cellar kitchen as folks await a visit from the Belschnikel, a traditional Pennsylvania German character who made his rounds during the Christmas season. He is the one who really knows if you were naughty or nice.

A final stop in the Engel Education Building for complimentary refreshments adds a final festive touch to the visit. As you leave be sure to stop in the Holiday Gift Shop which is stocked with heritage crafts handmade by Quiet Valley artisans. It is the place to find unique gifts at reasonable prices.



- 1/2 Water




# **Directions:**

Editor's Note: Last month was Breast Cancer Awareness Month. The pink sea of ribbons have faded away and the reminders about mammograms have all but ceased. But cancer does not take a day off, or a vacation, it continues to affect millions of women diagnosed with Breast Cancer every day. This is a story of one courageous woman, Stephanie McCormick and her battle with cancer written by her sister in law.

# Our Beautiful Warrior Stephanie McCormick and her Journey with Stage 4 Metastases Breast Cancer By Nichole Smith

I am writing this story to help raise awareness about breast cancer and to save the lives of women. Stephanie is my sister-in-law, and this is her story as it began in January, 2016. Steph started exercising, to get healthy and in early May she started to have severe back pain. She slowed down a bit, thinking she was just over doing it. As her pain was more and more unmanageable by June, she visited the ER several times. They finally took an X-ray and to her dismay, she was informed that she had Stage 4 breast cancer and it was in her bones. That was June 14, 2016, a day I will never forget. My brother Nick, Stephanie's husband called to break the news to me. My heart sank. How can this be? She is young (39), a wife, a mother of two small children, a daughter? How? Treatments began and we were very hopeful. Lots of prayers got us through each day. Steph was in and out of long hospital stays, and with each passing day, her bones became more fragile, the cancer had spread to almost all her bones and she broke most of her ribs; sometimes, from just breathing. Steph was slowly declining and was bound to her hospital bed at her home, but we stayed hopeful for her so she would continue to fight. She and my brother, Nick were married June 22, 2015. They bought their first home and shared a son Draven and a daughter Zarra together. Her mom and dad were by her side through all of this. This is what she fought so hard for, her family. Nick called to inform us that things have taken a turn for the worst, Steph only had 2-3 months to live. She declined so fast, becoming more and more frail, hardly able to speak. Right up until 2 days before her passing, I would say "Hello beautiful Warrior" and it would put the biggest smile on her face; Priceless! We all prepared to say our farewells, for now, until we would meet again over the beautiful rainbow. This was one of the hardest things my family had to endure. As she declined more, our hearts grew heavier, even though we knew she would not suffer anymore. It broke our hearts to watch this amazing, free spirited, loving soul enter a new world and leave this one. Steph was the most courageous and resilient woman I have ever met. She was always smiling when the children were around, never wanting them to see her fear or pain. She loved her family more than life itself. Cancer had stolen so much from her and her family. My brother, a widower at 38, her parents lost their child, the children lost their Mommy, I lost my sister, my daughter lost her aunt, and her friends lost an amazing friend. Why? Why does cancer have to exist? This was the prime of her life. I always believed you should never say something isn't fair, but tell me how this is fair? She lived a and fought for her family and now she will always protect and guide them from Heaven. Steph fought until literally her last days, surrounded by her family, husband at her side. I held her hand while her 5 year old son did the most courageous thing I have ever seen. As Steph took her final breath at 1:50pm on Saturday, June 2, 2018, Draven laid on his Mommy's belly and said, "Mommy I love you" and then

looked up into her eyes and said with the strongest voice "MOMMY I LOVE YOU!" It was so heartbreaking, while beautiful at the same time. It was almost as if her son was telling her it was okay. As time is healing slowly, we continue to stick together as a family, and we will all get through this. I remember a few days prior to her passing my brother told me he feels like he is bracing for the storm of a lifetime, he was right, it was, but he is not alone. He has family and God to get him through this. Steph had genetic Stage 4 Metastases Breast cancer that had spread to her bones, liver and lungs. By sharing Steph's story I hope to encourage women to look for signs, as early detection is key. Please get your yearly mammograms. Please remember you can get breast cancer at any age, you know your body so listen to yourself if something concerns you, call your doctor. This was the worst thing to happen to my family and we don't know exactly how to manage but somehow we will. Steph blessed so many lives along her journey here and she will forever hold a special place in all of our hearts. Life is precious, it should not be taken for granted. Trust in God first, love everyone, and always forgive. Live for today and cherish each second of your lives, for tomorrow is not promised to any of us. October 02, 2018 marked 4 months that our beautiful angel left this world. A lot has happened to my family this year and now the holiday season is upon us, and although we will shed many tears we will still thank God for all the blessings he gives us each and every day, he gives us another chance to love and to be loved. God bless everyone.
