Slate Belt Heritage Center Preservation Award

The Slate Belt Heritage Center, located at 30 Forth 1st Street, Bangor, Pa, is pleased to announce that it is now accepting applications for its' "Annual Heritage Award". The purpose of the award is to acknowledge individuals who have performed exemplary acts that promote and preserve the culture and heritage of the Slate Belt. Candidates may be an individual or group and can be nominated by themselves or by another party.

There will be three (3) categories:

- 1. Initiative Award: Applicant who has performed exemplary actions in promoting and preserving the Slate Belt heritage through in-kind actions. This means acts that do not necessarily involve monetary donations but can be unpaid service for a preservation cause.
- 2. Architectural Award: Applicant who is saving or conserving a historic building, place or artifact where restoration is authentic to preservation.
- 3. Special Focus Award: Applicant who is saving or conserving tradition or a body of knowledge. That individual who contributes to educational information via exhibits, documentation, internet, archival, etc. Consideration is given to projects with:

1. A specific start and end date.

- 2. Whether the project meets Professionally accepted preservation and/or scholar standards.
- 3. Whether the project is considered "complete" with goals and how they were achieved.
- 4. Whether the project had a significant impact with before and after photographs for proof of information and/or proof that a historic piece would have been otherwise lost if the nominee had not completed the project.

Nominations will be accepted this fall and will be reviewed in January of each year. The awards will be presented at a special program in June. One prize will be awarded with the possibility of one per category depending on committee's review of candidates. Nominations should include a description of entry, photos (if applicable), and any pertinent documentation. The Heritage Center retains the right to exhibit and/or publish the application materials, including photographs. Applications for those not chosen will be held on file, indefinitely, for future consideration.

SBRPD Officers Receive Life Saving Awards

In December, 2017 Slate Belt Regional Police Department recognized two officers for life saving efforts.

The incident occurred on July 29th, 2017 in Pen Argyl Borough. Officers were

dispatched to a home for a report of a 53-year old unconscious male, CPR was in progress, Officer Shannon Young and Sqt. Jonathon Hoadley responded and were met on scene by Look Out Fire Company personnel. Officer Young and Fire Chief Dean Parsons attached an AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) while Grant Parsons, continued CPR. After the shock, Officer Young continued CPR until relieved by Sqt.

Hoadley who continued CPR until the patient was moved to a Suburban EMS Ambulance.

Both officers received the Department's Life Saving Awards for their actions.



Four Bangor Area High School students were accepted into the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association District 10 Band.

Selected students are Shanae Woods (Bass Clarinet). Corinthia Banks (Contra-alto Clarinet), Benjamin Crane (Trombone), and Tarvn Geiger (Baritone). They were among hundreds of students who auditioned from schools in the counties of Berks, Carbon, Lehigh, Monroe, Northampton, Pike, and Schuvlkill.

The students will be traveling to Easton Area High School in Easton, PA to participate in the festival Jan. 3 through Jan. 5. While there, they will work under the direction of guest conductor Dr. Peter Boonshaft, Professor of Music of Hofstra University.

Dr. Boonshaft, called one of the most exciting and exhilarating voices in music education today. He has been invited to speak or conduct in every state in the nation and around the world. Honored by the National Association for Music Education and Music For All as the first recipient of the "George M. Parks Award for Leadership in Music Education". His honors also include being selected three times as a National Endowment of the Symphony and Chamber Orchestras as well as coaching chamber for the Arts "Artist in Residence," three times awarded Honorary Life Membership in the Tri-M Music Honor Society, and being selected for the Center for Scholarly Research and Academic Excellence at Hofstra University.

Prior to this appointment at Hofstra, Dr. Boonshaft was on the faculty of Moravian College and the University of Hartford. He was Founder and Music Director of the Pennsylvania Youth Honors Concert Band and the Connecticut Valley Youth Wind Ensemble.

Dr. Boonshaft is the author of many critically acclaimed best-selling books on music education. He is extremely active as a quest conductor, clinician and speaker for conferences, festivals, concerts and workshops nationally and internationally.

Moves One Step Closer to \$50,000 College Scholarship

On December, 21, 2017, Trever Weidman, an eighth grade student at Bangor Area Middle School, won the school competition of the National

Geographic Bee on December 21 and a chance at a \$50,000 college scholarship. The school Bee, at which students answered questions on geography, was the first round in the 29th annual National Geographic Bee. Lilliana Priestaf, also in eighth grade. placed second.

Thousands of schools around the United States and in the five U.S. territories are participating in the 2018 National Geographic Bee. The school champions, including Trever, will take a qualifying test; up to 100 of the top

scorers on that test in each state will then be eligible to compete in their state Bee on April 6, 2018.

The National Geographic Society will provide an all-expenses paid trip to Washington, D.C., for state winners to participate in the Bee national championship rounds May 20-23, 2018. The firstplace national champion will receive a \$50,000 college scholarship, a lifetime membership in the Society including a subscription to National Geographic magazine, and a trip to the Galápagos Islands, courtesy of Lindblad Expeditions and National Geographic.

Spotted Lanternfly Public Meeting

The Spotted Lanternfly is an extremely invasive insect that affects gardens and landscape plants as well as important Pennsylvania commodities. Scavello Announces Community Conservation Partnerships Program Grant Awards in the 40th Senate District

Six recipients represented in the 40th Senate District have been awarded state grants by the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR), according to Senator Mario Scavello (R-40), who said the funding will enable the counties, local governments, and other conservation-related organizations to fulfill planning, acquisition and development of parks, recreation, conservation and greenway projects for the benefit of the communities and those area residents.

Scavello said that Community Conservation Partnerships Program Grants (CCPP), administered by DCNR, includes Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund (Key 93), the Environmental Stewardship Fund (Growing Greener I) and several federal funding sources.

Organizations in the 40th district that received grants include:

MONROE COUNTY - Chestnuthill Township — toward acquisition of approximately 60 acres for an addition to the Big Woods Natural Area and passive recreation.

Smithfield Township -- for rehabilitation and further development of Marshalls Falls Park. Work to include renovation of pedestrian/golf cart bridge; construction of pedestrian walkways, boardwalks, pedestrian bridges, scenic overlook and parking area; installation of signage; ADA access, landscaping, project sign and other related site improvements.

The Nature Conservancy -- toward acquisition of approximately 123 acres in Stroud Township for open space protection and passive recreation.

Northampton County - For development of the NorBath Trail in Northampton Borough, Allen Township and East Allen Township. Work to include the rehabilitation of approximately 4.8 miles of trail from Clear Springs Drive in Northampton Borough to Jacksonville Park in East Allen Township, three bridges, and a trailhead; ADA access, landscaping, project sign and other related improvements.

Lower Mount Bethel Township - toward acquisition of approximately 173 acres located along the Delaware River for open space protection and passive recreation.

Washington Township '- for further development of Washington Township Recreation Complex. Work to include construction of basketball and pickleball courts, nature play area, pump park, gaga ball pit, observation deck, dog park, disc golf course, parking area, pedestrian walkways and stormwater management measures; installation of nature play equipment and fitness equipment; ADA access, landscaping, project sign and other related improvements.

"I am very proud to support this grant program, which provides vital funding for parks and conservation related efforts and offers residents a chance to experience the outdoors and spend time with family and friends," Scavello said. "The funding is vital to many of their budgets and the great work they do every day."





Broccoli Cheddar Chicken Soup

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 lbs. cooked and shredded chicken
- 2 bags frozen broccoli
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup milk
- 4 cups Sharp cheddar cheese shredded
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 8 cups chicken broth
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper

DIRECTIONS:

1. In a frying pan, saute' the onions and garlic over medium-heat until the onions become soft.







- 2. Reduce the heat and add the butter and flour to the onion and garlic and simmer until the mixture becomes brown.
- 3. Transfer the mixture from the frying pan into a deep soup pot and add the chicken broth. Stir frequently to reduce lumps in the mixture.
- 4. Add in the garlic powder, broccoli, chicken, salt, cayenne pepper, black pepper to the pot and allow to simmer for 40 minutes. Stir frequently to prevent sticking to the bottom of the pan.
- 5. Just before serving, add in the cheese and milk and stir well.
- 6. Garnish with a sprinkle of cheese.

Assistive Technology Tools to improve the everyday

Examples of AT devices and tools include:

- * Hearing aids
- * Vehicle modifications, such as hand controls or wheelchair lifts
- * Devices that help with bathing and eating
- * Software modifications for those with hearing and visual challenges
- * Equipment, such as grab bars in a shower, to help prevent falls
- * Eye glasses and magnification devices to help individuals with low vision
- * Communication devices for individuals with speech disabilities
- * Wheelchairs, walkers and other mobility devices

The right AT for you

At first, trying to find the right AT tools and solutions can feel overwhelming. The network of State Assistive Technology Act Programs is a good place to start. Your state AT Act program can provide information and support to help you identify and acquire AT that meets your needs.

These programs offer:

- * Device demonstration and short-term loan programs that allow you to try out equipment before purchasing
- * Reuse programs that provide gently used devices at substantial savings
- * Financing options, such as cash loan programs, that can help you get the AT devices you need

You can find the AT Act Program in your state or territory at acl.gov/AT. You'll also find additional information on state AT programs, data about the network of state AT programs and additional resources to help you find and obtain AT that fits your needs.
