FLU SEASON

This year's flu season is very dangerous causing above normal hospitalizations and even flu related deaths across the country. Chances are someone you know has been stricken will this year's strain. Influenza is a virus that

typically begins to appear in the Fall and then recedes as Spring progresses. This season the flu has been hitting left and right and sparing very few. Supplementation of immune boosting vitamins like vitamin C, vitamin D3, magnesium, zinc and of course probiotics should be taken daily. Taking elderberry syrup daily is also a great way to boost the immune system since it contains high levels of vitamin A, B, and C. It is also good to take in higher quantities when sick with the flu. Since its natural it is safe for children. I make my own to save money (see recipe below) since a small bottle is \$15 at the health food store. Echinacea is an herb that has been used to treat respiratory infections. Several studies show that echinacea can help prevent you from getting a cold or the flu, and lessen the symptoms when you get it. It is believed to increase production of white blood cells. If you do get the flu there are several things you can do to help it pass guicker and alleviate symptoms. Besides taking the vitamins and supplements listed above there is a homeopathic medicine for the flu called Oscillococcinum that is sold in pharmacies and grocery stores. It is safe for children and adults and used world wide. No one seems to know how it works, but it has been effective for my family and I also use it as a preventative. Before getting a prescription flu

drug that has negative side effects try some natural and old fashion remedies to help. Take a detox bath with Epsom Salt. Drink plenty of clear and warm fluids, including bone broth which provides soothing gelatin and minerals. Remove white foods such as sugar, milk and grains. These types of foods suppress the immune system. Don't forget to get plenty of rest. If you have concerns about any sickness or what medicine to take, always talk to your doctor. Enjoy! Jackie



My Favorite Elderberry Syrup (courtesy of Pinterest)

2/3 cup black elderberries 3.5 cups of water

2 T fresh or dried ainger root

1 tsp cinnamon powder 1/2 tsp cloves or clove powder 1 cup raw honey

Instructions: Pour water into medium saucepan and add elderberries, ginger, cinnamon and cloves (do not add honey) Bring to a boil and then cover and reduce to a simmer for about 45 minutes to an hour until the liquid has reduced by almost half. At that point, remove from heat and let cool enough to be handled. Pour through a strainer into a glass jar or bowl.

Discard the elderberries and let the liquid cool to lukewarm. When it is no longer hot, add 1 cup of honey and stir well. When honey is well mixed into the elderberry mixture, pour the syrup into a pint sized mason jar or 16 ounce glass bottle of some kind. Store in the fridge and take daily for its immune boosting properties. Standard dose is $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp to 1 tsp for kids and $\frac{1}{2}$ Tbsp to 1 Tbsp for adults. If the flu does strike, take the normal dose every 2-3 hours instead of once a day until symptoms disappear.







Citrus - Ginger Grilled Salmon

Prep Time: 30 minutes Cook Time: 20 Minutes

Ingredients:

1 large salmon filet 4-5 ounce Asian sesame-ginger dressing 2 teaspoon minced garlic Fresh-grated or ground dried ginger Fresh-ground black pepper 1 large grapefruit 2 teaspoon brown sugar

Directions:

In a large non-metal dish, arrange the salmon and cover with the sesame-ginger dressing and top with minced garlic, ginger, and freshground black pepper. Allow the salmon to marinate for 15-30 minutes before baking.

Preheat oven to 350° (or heat grill) and place the salmon in a heavy skillet or baking pan. Slice the grapefruit into rounds, and arrange over the salmon, drizzle it with a spoonful of the marinade. Sprinkle with brown sugar. Bake until done. When the fish flakes apart and looks opaque and no longer translucent, it's done. Fish filets will take about 10 minutes per inch thick; 20 minutes for 2-inch-thick filets.

Portabello Mushroom Burgers

Ingredients:

- 4 Large Portobello caps
- 4 Tablespoons Balsamic vinegar
- 2 Tablespoon oil
- 1 Teaspoon soy sauce
- 1 Tablespoon Diion mustard
 - 4 Burger buns

Directions:

Whisk together vinegar, oil, soy sauce and mustard in a shallow dish or pan, place the mushroom caps in the liquid, spoon some of the sauce over top of mushrooms. Marinate for15 minutes, turning once. Preheat grill to medium-high heat, then place the mushroom caps on the grates, spooning more of the sauce on top. Cook for 8-10 minutes, then flip, spoon on more of the liquid, and cook for another 8 minutes. Add cheese if desired during the last few minutes of cooking. When mushrooms are tender, remove from heat and place on bun along your favorite burger toppings. Serves 4

Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program Applications Now Available Wednesdays: Mexican Train /LCR 10:00am

State Senator Lisa M. Boscola today announced that applications for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program are now available online and at her local Thursday: Wii Bowling offices. This year's filing deadline is June 30.

"This is an excellent program for our seniors and I encourage everyone to see if they are eligible for this program," Boscola said. "The rebate check goes a long way in providing assistance to those who need it most."

Applicants must apply yearly. The rebate amount is based on annual income and paid property taxes for each calendar year. Individuals eligible for the program include Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with permanent disabilities over the 2/22 Water Colors w/Pam age of 18.

In 2008 Boscola voted for the law that more than doubled the income limit for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program from \$15,000 to \$35,000. The measure also raised the maximum rebate for homeowners and renters from \$500 to \$650. Applicants can exclude half of their income earned from Social Security, Supplemental Security income, and Railroad Retirement Tier 1 benefits when applying for a rebate.

Boscola has also introduced legislation that would freeze property tax rates for seniors, and co-sponsored a bill that would totally shift the school funding burden away from property taxes.


