NCC spreads cheer through Holiday Bazaar

A way for students to get a few gifts for those they care about this season. the Northampton Community College (NCC) Holiday Bazaars have been a huge hit for more than a decade. Several days in December are reserved for students to come in and choose gifts in designated areas stocked with donated items from NCC faculty and staff. The bazaars feature items like holiday décor, DVDs, jewelry, children's toys, housewares and more.

The idea for the bazaar came during a recession, when it was especially tough on students to afford gifts during the holidays. Faculty and staff felt this was something NCC could do to help brighten the lives of students and their families, by letting them "shop" for free. The bazaars serve hundreds of students between three NCC locations.

The Bethlehem bazaar offered the first ten students to arrive at the bazaar each day mugs put together by NCC nursing program students, and they were filled with goodies like hot cocoa, granola bars, candy canes and the like. All attendees at the bazaar could also enter into a raffle for an ab machine or a children's bicycle. On Monroe Campus, the Food Court in Pocono Hall was transformed into a shopping center for students. At both campuses, a wrapping station and bagging area was set up for students to put the finishing touches on their gifts.

NCC dental hygiene students acted as guides for the day. Jen Kszak, NCC's program manager of community programs at Fowler Center said. "It's all about community, and being able to not only offer it to students but also a group in the community through the Holy Infancy School is very important to us. The kids absolutely love the students who help out with this.'



Lucky Foods to Eat on New Year's Day
The year is quickly coming to a close and whether it's been a great year
for you or the opposite, we can all look forward to the new year with optimism. There are some traditions and superstitions that claim eating certain foods on New Year's Day is good luck. Here in Pennsylvania, many eat the traditional pork and sauerkraut (a German/Pennsylvania Dutch tradition) to ensure good luck in the new year. Listed below are a few other foods to eat while ringing in the new year to ensure Good Luck, Good Health, Good Cheer and a Happy New Year!

Many consider pork to be the luckiest of foods to eat on New Year's Day. Why? Pigs root forward with their snouts, which symbolizes progress for the coming year.

Black-Eyed Peas

Southern tradition is that the first food to be eaten on New Year's Day is Southern tradition is that the first food to be eaten on New Year's Day is black-eyed peas for good luck and prosperity. This tradition is actually a result of the American Civil War. Apparently when Union soldiers raided the Confederate food supplies, the only thing the Union left behind were black-eyed peas and salted pork. Essentially, these "leftovers" saved the lives of many slaves and Confederate soldiers, who otherwise would have starved. The tradition has since grown that, on New Year's Day, one must eat a pea for every day of the new year (365, or 366 during a leap year). Sometimes a coin is also added to the pot of peas before being plated. Whoever finds the coin among their serving of peas will be even luckier in the new year. But be sure to eat every pea on your plate, otherwise the good luck won't stick!

Sauerkraut

For those of you with superstitious grandparents, you may have heard the Pennsylvania Dutch saying that children who eat sauerkraut on New Year's Day are in for a "sweet year." In addition, the long strands of sauerkraut are said to resemble a long life. Because sauerkraut begins as green cabbage, it also represents money. A sweet year, a long life, and financial prosperity? Pass the sauerkraut, please!

Eating leafy greens resembles paper money, and who wouldn't like a little extra cash in the new year? Collards, kale, and spinach are all good choices, as well as sauerkraut or cabbage, as mentioned above.

Grapes
Eating twelve grapes at midnight as the clock strikes twelve times, also recognizing the twelve months of the new year, is said to bring good luck. And you know what has been said about green symbolizing money, so perhaps making sure the grapes are green will ensure good luck with finances. Maybe playing the number twelve on your next lottery ticket will bring good luck, as well!

Lentils

Some choose to eat lentils on New Year's Day for the luck of wealth and prosperity, as the flat legumes have been said to resemble Roman coins.

It is doubtful that anyone has not heard the saying, "There are plenty of fish in the sea." As such, eating fish on New Year's Day symbolizes abundance in the new year. Their silvery scales also represent plenty of coinage. Cha-Ching!

Noodles

Long noodles eaten without breaking them in half or chewing them are symbolic of a long life. So toss your manners aside and slurp some noodles on New Year's Day.

Ring-Shaped Foods
Don't forget breakfast! Donuts and bagels represent the year coming full circle.

Cakes can also be baked in rings and, in some cultures, a coin is baked inside on January 1st. The one who finds it in their slice of cake is said to get an extra serving of good luck for the coming year.

Seeds have long been associated with fertility. Crack open a pomegranate on New Year's Day and eat the seeds, which symbolize life and abundance.
